

600 International Buyers Arrive For Samples Show

TORONTO (CP) — Aircraft, arriving with more than 600 buyers from Britain, Europe, the West Indies and the United States, Monday inaugurated phase two of Canada's Operation World Markets.

For the next three days—today, Wednesday, Thursday—the buyers will look at a wide range of manufactured goods at the National Canadian Samples Show.

In 420 separate exhibits they will see clothing, footwear, appliances, household supplies,

hardware, heating and plumbing equipment, radio and television sets, hi-fi equipment, drugs, toiletries, luggage, food, confectionery, tobacco and other items.

The showing to department store people follows last week's phase one of the trade operation, in which engineers and other industrial executives from more than 50 countries visited machinery equipment manufacturing plants across Canada.

Arrivals from Britain and Europe number 121; from the West Indies 106; and from the

United States 398—from New York, Boston, Philadelphia, Washington, Detroit, Cleveland, Chicago, New Orleans, San Francisco and Los Angeles.

They are from department stores, chain stores and supermarkets and the exhibits are confined to things handled by such businesses.

The showing to department store people follows last week's phase one of the trade operation, in which engineers and other industrial executives from more than 50 countries visited machinery equipment manufacturing plants across Canada.

Purpose of the operation, in the words of a department of trade and commerce news re-

lease, is "to help Canadian producers acquire a greater share of the markets in areas where surveys by our trade commissioners show that more Canadian products can be sold."

The show is organized by the department and the government pays the cost of bringing the buyers to Toronto. Participating Canadian companies pay \$20 for each display unit they reserve. This is to cover rental
