The frequency factor alone makes the subject worthy of very careful study. South got a spade lead which he won with the ten. He could count as sure winners three spade tricks, three hearts and two clubs. This came to a total of eight tricks. Declarer saw that there were two sources for a possible ninth trick. One was to play West for the ace of diamonds, in which case a lead towards the king would provide trick number nine. The other was to play East for the queen of clubs. In
