

Crime, Strange Senseless Takes Place In Headlines

Crime, strange and senseless, wrote its story anew. The ravages of a warped imagination made headlines.

"I'll take you first because you're a girl."

Those words, spoken on the steps of a church, were a death sentence for four-year-old Carole

Voce of Toronto. They meant that she was taken for a bicycle

ride by a smiling youth, leaving her playmate, Johnny Auld, also 4, Johnny was supposed to take a

ride when Carole returned. She never did.

Carole's body, beaten and mutilated, was found in a re-use-strewn ravine. Peter Woodcock, 17, brilliant student at a private

school, was charged with the killing.

George Metesky, 33, confessed that he planted 32 bombs in public

places in one of the world's largest cities since 1940.

He said he wanted to terrorize, but not to kill, people because he

of compensation after an injury years ago.

Detectives yanked George out of bed at his home in Waterbury

Conn., where he lived with two daughters, older sisters.

The man, who chatted and joked happily with reporters, was

put in the care of psychiatrists for tests. A dispute started for

\$25,000 reward money offered for his capture.

THE BIG DAY In the simplicity, ceremony and fun-making of the United States

presidential inauguration, Dwight D. Eisenhower took his oath of

office for a second term. At 66 he is the oldest man ever inducted

for a second White House term. The man who is known to the

world as he showed little sign of his recent illness during the strenuous

functions accompanying the inauguration. He spoke of American

strength and held out the hand of friendship to the Russian

people, stating: "We honor... the people of Russia. We welcome rather than

nominated Lt.-Gen. Hans Speidel, 59, for the post of commander of NATO ground forces in central

United States Seventh Army and the British Army of the Rhine,

together comprising 10 divisions. Canadian troops in Germany also

will be under him.

Scholarships Suggestion Is Given Report

OTTAWA (CP)—Members of all

Common parties Thursday expressed support of a resolution by

a Liberal member, A. H. Hollingworth, calling for a program of

national university scholarships.

But Progressive Conservative D. R. Michener voiced doubts

about the constitutional soundness of the government's present

proposals to accomplish that.

The member for Toronto St. Paul's said the central govern-

ment should instead give unconditional grants to the provinces for

education.

And a Quebec independent, Ferdinand Girard, member for

Lapointe, opposed the resolution on the ground that it offers no

guarantee that exclusive provincial rights in education would be

preserved.

He suggested that the government return to the provinces

"their fields of taxation."

The resolution presented by Mr. Hollingworth, member for York

Centre, is similar to one he put forward last session.

But debate on it, during the session's first day allocated for

private members' proposals, was in some respects a duplicate of what

has already been said on a government resolution already before

the House to establish the long-awaited Canada Council.

The only major question raised in debate on Mr. Hollingworth's

proposal involved the exclusive right given provinces under the

constitution to legislate in the field of education.

The resolution urged government consideration of enacting a

national scholarship program insofar as it was "within the competence

of Parliament."

Mr. Hollingworth, in a part of his speech spoken in French,

asked for the support of MPs from Quebec.
