Williams, a 4-1 favorite over his young and less-experienced opponent, closed Cardell's left eye and bloodied his right but was unable to floor him. Cardell, at 145, had a two-pound weight advantage for the scheduled 10-round bout.

List Contenders For Welter Titles

HAGERSTOWN, Ind., Feb. 1 (AP) - The National Boxing Association Wednesday listed four principal contenders for the welterweight title in the event welter champion Sugar Ray Robinson wins the middleweight crown next month. The N.B.A. ruled recently that Robinson will lose his welterweight title if he wins the middleweight championship from Jake Lamotta in Chicago Feb. 14. The welterweight contenders were listed as Kid Gavilan of Cuba, Billy Graham of New York, Charlie Purari of Irvington, N.J., and John Bratton of Chicago. An elimination tournament will be ordered by the N.B.A. if the welterweight title is vacated.

Cardinals Would Cut Salaries Of Two Stars

ST. LOUIS, Feb. 1 (AP) - An authoritative source reported that owner Fred Saigh of St. Louis Cardinals seeks to cut the salary of two of his stars - outfielder Enos Slaughter and second baseman Red Schoendienst. Slaughter, these reports say, has been offered a contract calling for a cut of 25 per cent, a reduction estimated at \$8,300. The aging warhorse, who was unavailable for comment, was said to have turned the contract down. The 25-per-cent cut is the maximum allowed under baseball law. Saigh also has drawn a balk from Schoendienst on a reported contract calling for a 14-per-cent salary reduction.

Canadian Boy Wins Imperial Cadet Trophy

OTTAWA, Feb. 1 (CP) - A Canadian army cadet team again has won the Earl Roberts Imperial Cadet Trophy for service rifle marksmanship among cadets of the Empire. The army said Saturday the 1950 winner was No. 323 Provencher School Cadet Corps, St. Boniface, Man. The trophy was won in 1949 by No. 1196 Ecole Superieure St. Stanislas Cadet Corps of Montreal and was the first Canadian victory in the shoot for many years. The competing teams are selected annually from each military area in Canada and each military district in the United Kingdom and Commonwealth countries. They fire five rounds with service rifles at 500 yards, five rounds fire-with-movement at 100 and 500 yards, five rounds rapid at 200 yards and five rounds snap at 200 yards. The Canadian team this year posted a score of 312 points to edge the 7th Gloucester Regiment, Royal Artillery Cadet Corps, which scored 311 points. Members of the winning Canadian team are Cadet Captain Raymond Pelletier and Cadets Raymond Duguay, Albert Maigny, Elmer Sokolowski and Henry Decuyper. Canadian teams won 14 places among the first 37. Four of the Canadian teams finished among the first 10. In addition to the Provencher Corps, they are No. 1195 Ecole Superieure St. Stanislas Cadet Corps, Halifax, 8th; and No. 62 Hamilton Central Collegiate Institute Cadet Corps, Hamilton, 10th.

Pep Mauled In Charity Bout

HARTFORD, Conn., Feb. 1 (AP) - Willie Pep, former world's featherweight champion, emerged from a nearly disastrous charity bout Wednesday in a slightly damaged condition but he will be fit and ready to meet the current champion, Sandy Saddler, either later in March or early in April. The exact date depends upon the availability of Madison Square Garden, Pep's trainer, Bill Gore said today. Pep suffered a deep cut over his right eye when he was accidentally bitten by Tommy Baker in the third round of a scheduled 10-round bout staged for a local polo fund, Pep, who battered Baker so badly in the fourth round that he won on a technical knockout, needed 20 stitches to close the gash.

Germans Win Bobsled Title

ALPE D'HEUZ, France, Feb. 1 (AP) - Germany won the four-man bobsled championship Wednesday for a clean sweep of honors in its first post-war participation in world title meets. The Germans, piloted by Andreas Ostler, literally ran the runners off all their competition. The United States, which had won the title the last three years, finished second. Switzerland was third. The Germans scored the fastest time for each of the two runs down the 1,584-meter course. They were clocked at one minute, 13.33 seconds and set a course record of 1 minute, 11.65 seconds on the second run for a total time of 2:24.98. This is an average of about 63 miles an hour.

fertility is only slightly lowered repeated selection of the more fertile plants may build seed production up to a satisfactory level.

Since 1940 most of the important economic crop plants of the world have been investigated using colchicine treatments. While it is true that the results in a high percentage of the cases have not been advantageous, the few valuable new species obtained in this way are well worth the trouble of the extensive investigations. At the Division of Forage Plants, Ottawa, such new varieties have been produced and tested extensively, says Dr. J. M. Armstrong. The following species have reacted unfavorably to colchicine treatment - field roots (mangels, sugar beets and swedes), soybeans, sunflowers, alfalfa and several grass species. Species that show promise are red clover, alsike and oil-seed rape. In red clover the new forms show a considerable increase in size and are more resistant to such diseases as mildew root-rot than the ordinary variety. While the fertility has been lowered, selection is proving effective. The new variety of oil-seed rape has proved superior to the normal in yield and seed size. In the case of this species there was no reduction in fertility. Tests of the chemical and physical characteristics of the extracted oil showed superiority over that obtained from the normal plant in several respects.

Creation Of New Species Of Forage Crops

OTTAWA, Feb. 1, 1951 - Colchicine, a drug obtained from the seeds of meadow saffron, is proving a valuable substance to the plant breeder in creating new species and new varieties. By applying a weak, aqueous solution of the drug to germinating seeds or the growing tissue of plants cells becomes altered. All succeeding cells that arise from these treated cells are also altered. This can lead to the creation of new plant forms that differ strikingly from the original plants. In many cases the new plant forms are greatly increased in size and may show changes in the chemical constitution. On the other hand there may be a reduction in fertility, which, if serious, rules out the possibility of the economic use of such plant forms. If the
