Sir,—

I have the honor to inform you that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance with respect to the following Acts of the Legislature of Prince Edward Island, transcripts of which accompanied from Despatch No. 94, of the 14th of October last, viz:—

Cap. I, "An Act for raising a revenue."

Cap. XVII, "An Act further to amend the Acts for the regulation of the Militia and Volunteer Forces."

Cap. XXIII, "An Act in further amendment of the Act incorporating the Summerside Bank."

Cap. XXXIV, "An Act to enable the Government to secure Telegraphic Communication."

I referred this last Act for the consideration of the Board of Treasury, and I have the honor to transmit to you an extract from the reply which has been received from their Lordships.

I feel much apprehension that the Colony may hereafter find itself hampered by having granted to the Company such concessions as are confined by this Act, and the Act of 17th Vic., Cap. 4, and may observe that the grant of such exclusive privileges violates the principles now acted upon by Her Majesty's Government, in dealing with these Companies.

I have received and have had under my consideration the Act passed by the Legislature of Prince Edward Island, in the month of April last, Cap. 20, entitled "An Act to add to and amend the Act relating to patents for useful inventions," a transcript of which accompanied from Despatch No. 94, of the 14th of October last.

I have reported to the Queen in Council, my opinion that the said Act should be specially confirmed, and I transmit to you, herewith, an order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the fifth instant, approving that report.

At the Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, the 5th day of February, 1870.

PRESENT: The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, Lord President, Mr. Secretary Bruce, Lord Chamberlain, Mr. Gladstone.

WHEREAS, the Administrator of the Government of Her Majesty's Island of Prince Edward, with

the Council and Assembly of the said Island, did, on the month of April, 1869, pass an Act, which has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz.—

Cap. XX, "An Act to add to and amend the Act relating to Patents for useful inventions."

And, whereas, the said Act has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with a letter to the Lord President of the Council, from the Right Honorable Earl Granville, one of Her Majesty's principal Secretaries of State, recommending that the said Act should receive Her Majesty's special confirmation. Her Majesty was, therefore, this day, pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to declare Her special confirmation of the said Act, and the same is hereby specially confirmed, ratified, and finally enacted accordingly.

Whereof, the Governor, Lieut. Governor, or Commander in Chief, for the time being, of Her Majesty's Island of Prince Edward, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
