SCHOLARSHIP FOR CONSERVATION— agriculture or natural resource conservation, related curriculum (working toward a B.Sc. degree). Should have interest in conservation and technical competence; to pursue a career in field. Valued at \$1000.00. Deadline March 1, 1988.

round trip transportation, education, and living expenses. Deadline March 1, 1988 (1 1/2 years prior to year of study).

TOURISM INDUSTRY SCHOLARSHIP— open to those in the tourism industry and others aged 17-25, avg. mark of 70 percent, with plans to work for Tourism in summer months, work minimum of 2 years in Tourism. Valued at \$1000.00. Deadline February 18, 1988

UPEI MEMORIAL BURSARY FUND— awarded based upon need, to second semester, full-time students. Valued at \$125.00 - \$300.00 Deadline February, 1988

The Intramural Hockey

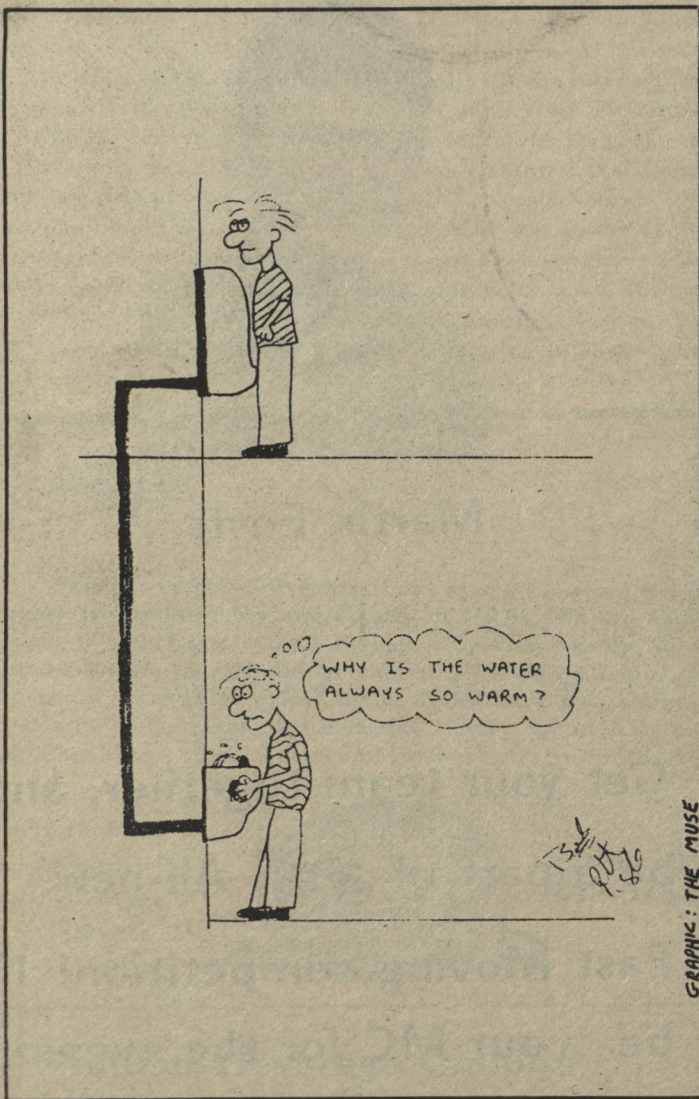
