UNION PLAN

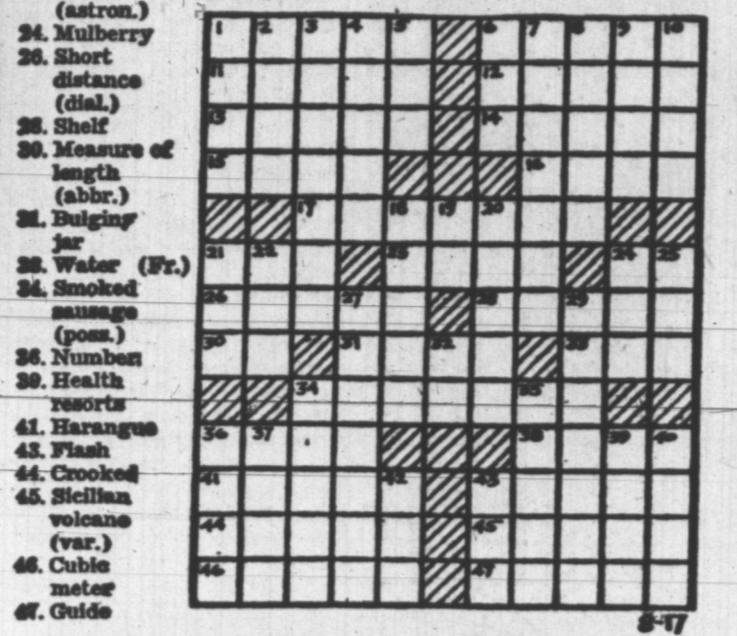
