Arrangements are now underway at R.C.A.F. Station, Summerside preparing the exhibits and aerial displays which will go toward making the Lobster Carnival Air Show on July 20th an interesting and thrilling event for young and old. The normally secure station gate will be wide open from 1:00 p.m. Atlantic Standard Time on Saturday the 20th of July to all who care to attend this exciting display. A flying exhibition by many of Canada's fighting aircraft will highlight the show. An F-86 Sabre Jet, the first line jet fighter of Canada's Nato air divisions, will perform at near supersonic speeds and if conditions permit, the slick jet may actually break the sound barrier producing the famous sonic boom. An Avro CF-100 "Canuck," the Canadian made all weather twin-jet fighter, featuring the famous Orrenda jet engine has been requested and if available will give those in attendance an opportunity to see the aircraft that forms the striking arm of North American northern defences. Other jet aircraft in the Aerial display will likely include the T33 "Silver Star" jet trainer and the Navy's carrier borne fighter the "Banshee."

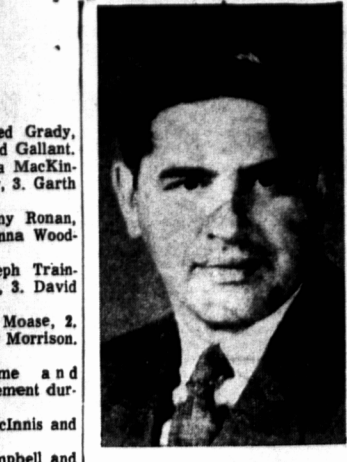

UK TESTS ROCKET

CANBERRA (AP)—Britain has sent an upper atmosphere testing rocket, known as the Skylark, 50 miles above the earth in a proving trial at Woomera rocket range. Supply Minister Howard Beale said Thursday the Skylark was designed to carry 65 pounds of instruments to a height of 100 miles at a speed 2,500 miles an hour. The rocket is being developed for use during the international geophysical year.
