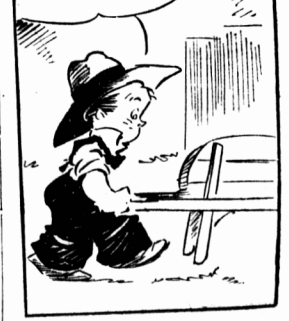

Round trip London to the Cape: seven days, 22 hours, 46 minutes flying time and less than 11 days total elapsed time.
