

Emphasizes Achievements Of B. And P. Women's Clubs

In an interview with Mrs. W. Dunbar, Provincial president of the Business and Professional Women's Clubs last evening, some of the accomplishments of the National Federation of B. and P. Clubs during the past two years were reviewed. Mrs. Dunbar pointed out that the National Federation played a prominent part in having the Federal Equal Pay Act passed for civil servants in August, 1956. This act came into effect on January 1st of this year. The Federation also urged the appointment of a woman commissioner of Federal Civil Service, and saw this become a reality in February, 1957.

Additional accomplishments in which the Canadian Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs shared were the signing and ratification by Canada of the U.N. Convention on Political Rights of Women, as well as of the U.N. Convention on the Nationality of Married Women on February 20, 1957. "And in the local field," said Mrs. Dunbar, "our Charlotte-town and Summerside Clubs have many accomplishments to their credit. Last winter a committee composed of members of both clubs was well received when it presented a brief to the Provincial Government on Equal Pay for Equal Work."

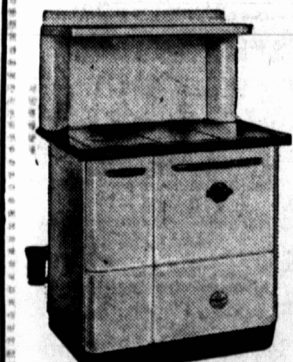

Walter Raleigh Gilbert Visits

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—Commander Walter Raleigh Gilbert, descendant of Sir Humphrey Gilbert who claimed Newfoundland for the English Crown in 1583, arrived here Tuesday to spend three days as guest of Lieutenant Governor Sir Leonard Outerbridge.

Commander Gilbert, High Sheriff of Devon, and his wife landed at Gander, earlier in the day and were met by Magistrate and Mrs. Cramm and an RCMP guard of honor.

Following their Newfoundland visit they plan to fly to Bath, Maine, which is currently celebrating its founding by Raleigh Gilbert in 1607. From Bath they will go to Jamestown to be guests of the commission in charge of that town's 350th anniversary.

The naval commander lives in Compton Castle, family seat of the Gilberts since it was built in 1320 by Geoffrey Gilbert.
