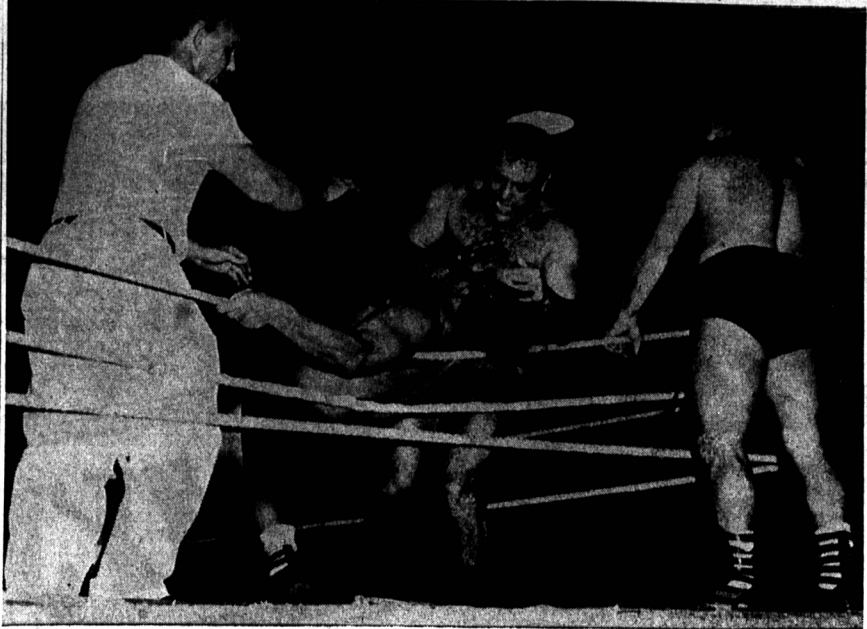

No Increased Canadian Aid To Colombo Plan

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada has informed her Colombo plan partners that she will have \$33,400,000 available for aid to Asian democracies in the next 12 months.

Informants said this outline of Canadian aid to Asia was given by Fisheries Minister Sinclair and Resources Minister Lesage, who along with Finance Minister Harris are representing Canada at the week-long meeting.

Alaska Highway May Pass From Army's Control

OTTAWA (CP)—The 1,200-mile Alaska highway, built by U.S. army engineers during the war and later turned over to Canada, may soon pass out of control of the Canadian army to some federal department of government, probably public works.
