A letter was read from C. F. Fraser, asking a grant for the Halifax School for the Blind. The sum of \$150 was voted. A communication from certain residents of Lower Spring Park Road asking for a sidewalk was referred to the Street committee.

Councilor Hooper gave notice that at the next meeting it was his intention to introduce a by law respecting the bye law of a dog meat.

The tender of J. M. Barrett for plank was accepted.

The warehouse on Queen's wharf was leased to David Small for \$80 per annum. Councilor Crabbe submitted the estimate for the current year as follows:

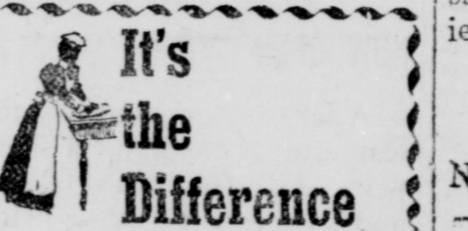

The steps having been narrated, the moderator put the questions of the formula which were satisfactorily answered by Mr. Whidden, who was then by prayer and the right hand of fellowship inducted into the pastoral charge of Bedouque.

Messrs C. McKay, and J. M. Fisher addressed the minister and people on their respective duties. Mr. Whidden having signified his willingness to sign the formula his name was added to the roll.

The Presbytery then adjourned to meet in Zion Church, Charlottetown, on Tuesday, May 10th, at 11 a. m.
