

House Committee Approve Deepening Lakes Channel

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House of Representatives public works committee Wednesday unanimously approved legislation authorizing deepening of the connecting channels in the upper Great Lakes at a cost of \$115,818,000.

Representative John Blatnik (Dem. Minn.), chairman of a subcommittee which held a two-day hearing on the legislation at which no opposition witnesses appeared, said he will make every effort to get House action before Congress adjourns.

The legislation would authorize a 27-foot channel from Lake Erie to Lake Superior. It is designed to tie in with the St. Lawrence seaway now under construction. The administration recently gave its approval to the project.

The committee acted after army engineers asked Congress for authority to deepen the channels. The request was based upon a report by the chief of engineers

Brazilian Congress Goes To Thousand Convicts

RIO DE JANEIRO (Reuters)—One thousand Brazilian convicts with shaven heads and in prison uniforms went to confession here Monday as part of the ceremonies marking a week-long international ecumenical congress which opened Sunday.

Roman Catholic priests and army chaplains went to all prisons at dawn to start hearing the confessions. Tuesday, the prisoners will receive holy communion.

The cardinal archbishop of Rio, Msgr. Jaime de Barros Camara, commented:

"It is fitting that the congress should go among the prisoners, particularly when many of them are confined for such activities as gambling or chicken stealing, while other greater criminals remain at liberty because of the protection afforded by their money."

It is estimated that by the time the congress ends next weekend, nearly 42,000 masses will have been celebrated and about seven tons of wafers used in administering holy communion.

Sunday night about 500,000 persons lined the streets as a mile-long procession of 100,000 persons, including 10 cardinals and 100 bishops, wound through the city at the opening of the annual congress, the 36th organized by the Roman Catholic Church.

Dock Strike Cost Britain £80,000,000 In Exports

LONDON (Reuters) — Britain's national dock strike in June cost the country about £80,000,000 in exports, a government survey estimated Wednesday.

It said the provisional total of exports for the month was £157,000,000 pounds, 36 per cent lower than the average for the two previous months. Almost the entire fall was attributed to the June strike.

Britain—vitaly dependent on exports to pay its huge import bill—exported 3½ per cent more goods during the first half of 1955 than in the first half of 1954. Imports during the same period in 1955 were 14 per cent higher than the previous year, the survey said.
