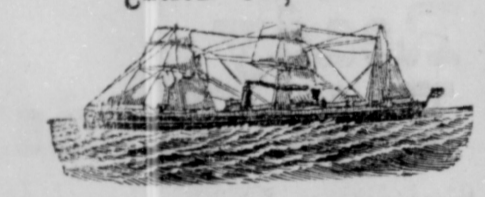

Of Special Interest to our Farmers

The Pioneer on Exhibitions.

SIR,—The last number of The Pioneer Extra (dubbed the Island Farmer) contains an editorial in which the leading idea is denunciation of agricultural exhibitions and their methods.

The editor is much exercised over the discovery of crooked acts by some exhibitors of Jersey cattle at Toronto and the side entertainments given at all the shows by travelling acrobats, circus performers, one-legged bicycle riders, diving girls, and miniatures battles and sieges.

The editor of that paper claims to be an Englishman, descended from a large line of English farmers. If that claim is true, he must know that Great Britain is the birthplace and home of the agricultural fair and cattle shows, and that the diversions and amusements provided by Canadian exhibition managers are mild, innocent and harmless when compared with the doings at any of those old country gatherings, where rascality, brutality and every species of the rogue the clown and gypsy congregate.

These characteristics of a British fair and cattle show are as evident now as they were three hundred years ago when Bunyon in Pilgrim's Progress wrote his description of "Vanity Fair." Yet British fairs have been the means of placing British breeds of horses, cattle sheep and swine, on an elevation high over those of any other country on earth. All the rest of the world, when in want of the best breeds of domestic animals go to Great Britain. The only exception to this wholesale assertion are the merino sheep and Holstein cattle. The horses of France Germany, Russia and the United States owe all their best qualities to the results of the British cattle show.

The Farmer's editorial advises its readers to use for improving the milk herds bulls bred from cows known in their locality to be good milk cows. In other words his advice is to use scrub or mongrel bulls as the sire of the future milk cow. The country that takes the advice of such an ignorant humbug is on the road to decay.

THE LADY WARWICK HOSTEL.

Where English Girls are Taught to be Practical Agriculturists.

The new movement by which women workers are seeking to bring about an improvement in the oldest and most depressed of English national industries is apparently meeting with a well-deserved reward, and as "the hand that rocks the cradle rules the world," so there need be no reason why it should not—in a sense at least—guide the plough, and otherwise shape the destinies of agriculture.

The students studying at the institution founded by Lady Warwick are no mere visionaries; but recognizing the difficulties of endeavoring to sever the Gordian knot of agricultural depression, display a surprising resolution in mastering the details, both practical and technical, of so much that pertains to soil cultivation.

to show solid success in any considerable undertaking, but already the gardens at the charming Hostel farm at Reading, Eng., bear ample evidence of careful and intelligent culture, while the knowledge gained by the young women toilers may well be expected to develop and bring forth the best of results in a personal and a collective sense.

Certainly the fair students display most remarkable energy in their work generally, and so present a contrast to the extreme ease of movement at times manifest both in men and horses engaged in agriculture.

Poultry rearing is being made a particularly distinctive feature, Orpington's being a specially favored variety; bee-keeping will be yet further developed, while miniature rabbit-warren is already a feature of the little holding, though confined to an area circumscribed by wire-netting.

In every way the hostel is well adapted for the wide course of instruction carried out under the able superintendence of Miss Bradley, the courteous and enthusiastic warden, who ardently believes in a strictly practical endeavor to make agriculture in its very phase become profitable.

The home comforts of the hostel are of the best and brightest, the greatest care being shown in making the lives of the students a happy part of their course of instruction.

The local farmers are ever to the fore in allowing the young women agriculturists to visit dairies, perambulate fields, and indeed, to range at free will wherever desired; while the Reading Agricultural College affords the widest sphere of its teaching to the fair cultivators.

Lady Warwick's admirable institution is not only novel in its inception, but eminently practicable in the knowledge gained being imparted to those whose lot it may be to remain as workers in rural districts. The students, after passing through so excellent a school will be fitted indeed to become instructors in cultivation.

The hostel bids fair to become a specially-recognized national institution, and thus justify the high hopes of its success which have been eloquently and earnestly expressed by Lady Warwick.

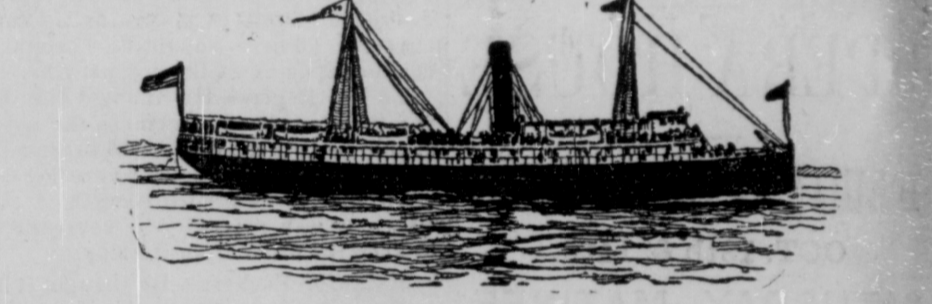
