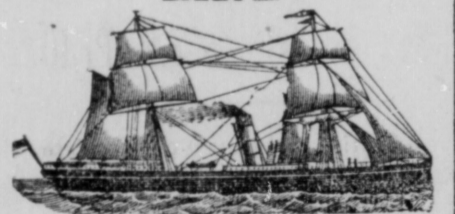

Of Special Interest to our Farmers

Farming Notes.

(From the Co-operative Farmer.)

If your sheep are in danger from dogs put a good loud team bell on each sheep and lamb, and if the flock is not too far removed from habitations, they will be heard when they are chased.

The Maritime farm is a steady employer of labor. There are no slack times nor off days on a well managed farm and a good day's wage can always be earned. Farming as a business is all right if we realize our opportunities and improve them.

Watch the water supply of your cows, do not let them drink from stagnant pools or swamps. Gas and taints in the milk frequently arise from the water taken by the cow. If you can't fence her away from all bad water, you can at least give her a plentiful supply of pure water.

There seems to be an increasingly good demand for sound, active heavy horses. Choice animals for city work, weighing from 1800 lbs. to 2000 lbs., are bringing for export from \$250 to \$375, so we learn from a friend in Montreal. One of them is equal in money value to at least six of the 1000 lb. colts so universally raised.

If dirt gets in the milk, you cannot strain it out, nor wash it out, nor brush it out. Its there to stay, to make mischief in the milk, taints in the butter and only a poor quality of cheese. In every case your products will bring lower return. Why when you know what the result will be do you permit dirt anywhere in or about your dairy?

Prof. J. W. Robertson has left for Great Britain to help work up an increased interest in Canadian farm products, where it is hoped the good work accomplished by him last year will be repeated. A few more years of such thorough advertising as Professor Robertson knows how to conduct, will make our food products known in every city and shire town in the United Kingdom.

As the busy season comes on, do not neglect those growing pullets. Feed them regularly and right; they will be money-makers next winter.

Give the pullets free range, but yard up the cockerels and force them to marketable size, and get the money for them in your pocket.

Keep the chicks' sleeping quarters clean and bedded. Do not let them roost too early; it produces crooked breast bones in young growing birds.

When walking over your farm, go with an open eye and a receptive mind. Note the condition of soil, of crops and of the stock. Attend to the little details, with cause and effect, and learn to be a better farmer each succeeding day.

Be sure the flocks and herds have a supply of pure water in the pasture. Some farmers think sheep can live upon dew and cows on water from any swamp. Thrift in the sheep or milk fit to use from the cows will not be had with such conditions.

Keep the cultivator going. Never let a root crop in July go more than six days without having the cultivator

through it. The expense per acre of horse cultivating is very small compared with benefits.

Remember to protect the cows from flies. Some oil with carbolic acid in it will prove very beneficial where spraying the animals with kerosene emulsion is not done. This spraying to be effective, must be done every morning.

Market your crops when you get them ready is a rule that may generally be followed with success. Arrange beforehand to have them ready at such times as your previous experience shows sales to be best.

Cut the grass before it gets woody is the advice offered by our correspondents, so have the mowing machinery ready to strike at the proper time. On most farms some hay must be cut too young in order that a great deal will not be left till it is too old.

Give the barn a thorough good cleaning before the new crops go into it. Put tight ceilings over your stables and arrange for ample ventilation into the open air. Don't ventilate the stables into the barn floor and have the roof dripping with moisture every time there is a thaw. Fodder kept in such a barn is unfit for healthy food.

The Farmer's Garden.

One reason why many farmers have poor success with their gardens is because they grow the same kind of vegetables year after year in the same place. A system of rotation should be followed in the garden as well as on the farm. If this is done care should be taken to have a goodly depth of subsoil turned up each year. In England a system of trenching is followed by some farmers, that is, digging the soil to a depth of two or three feet according to the nature of the soil, and adding a certain amount of subsoil to the surface soil. Barnyard manure is most valuable for garden purposes.—Ex.

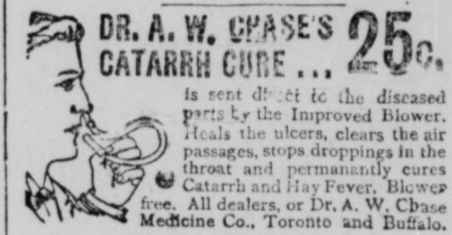
