**England Back On
Greenwich Time**

LONDON, Oct. 5.—Summer time in England ended last night. The movement here was generally popular save with a certain number of agriculturists and others who have the care of large bodies of children. No legal provision has been made, however, for continuing the expedient next year. The present rules lapse under the Defence of the Realm Act and an attempt to introduce legislation to continue the provisions proved fruitless.

Under Greenwich Time

Great Britain was yesterday working again under Greenwich Time. It is possible that the daylight saving plan will not be resumed in future. It is declared by newspapers, as it has encountered considerable opposition in agricultural quarters, and from theatrical, educational and railway interests. These are expected to endeavor to defeat the bill for making daylight saving a permanent feature each summer. The bill was introduced in parliament during the last session by the Home Secretary and forces opposing it will be marshalled, when it comes up for second reading after parliament re-assembles.

Claims Plan an Evil

The London Times today printed a long article written by Dr. Benj. Moore, Professor of Bio-chemistry, at Oxford, who argues that from the health point of view, daylight saving in summer is not a benefit but an evil, especially during a season of intense sunshine and high temperature, such as was experienced in the British Isles this year. He admits, however, that during a cold, dull summer daylight saving time might be beneficial. Dr. Moore contends that the plan of advancing the clocks one hour during the summer months is particularly disadvantageous to school children, agricultural interests and some industrial workers.

**MAJ.-GEN. MACDONELL
IS INJURED BY FALL**

Thrown From Horse in Storm,
Breaks Shoulder Blade.

KINGSTON, Oct. 3.—Maj-Gen Sir Archibald C. Macdonnell, commandant of the Royal Military College, was a victim of the cyclone at noon yesterday. The general was riding his horse along the road coming from Barrfield Heights. The animal became frightened at the storm and in its terror slipped on the wet and steep hill. The horse fell with its rider, the latter being pinned underneath the animal and suffered a fractured shoulder blade. Help was at hand and the injured man was removed to the general hospital.

**REASONS FOR JAPAN'S DIPLO-
MATIC STRATEGY IN CONFER-
ENCE ON LIMITING
ARMAMENT**

Here are reasons for Japan's conviction that their representatives must be governed by special considerations during the conference called by President Harding for the discussion of limitation of armaments and Far Eastern questions:

1. Because expansion is absolutely necessary for the survival of a population of 78,000,000 Japanese hemmed within the borders of an island territory only one-third larger than the State of Texas.
2. Because of her determination to hold on to the 750,000 miles of land area and to perpetuate her domination over more than a million miles of seas that she has acquired or seized since the Japanese-Russian war, eighteen years ago.
3. Because she is determined to provide a larger field for her rapidly growing merchant marine, through which she hopes to dictate the trade conditions of the Far East and the Pacific.
4. Because she will demand non-interference with her programme for exploiting the natural and commercial resources of northern China, Korea, Manchuria, Mongolia and Siberia, whose populations aggregating nearly 30,000,000 are defenceless against her huge army and splendid navy.
5. Because of her ambition to dominate through the application of imperialistic policies the political and economic fortunes of the countries she has coerced with her political machine and from which she must secure raw materials to gratify her ambition for world power.
6. Because she is determined to find homes and occupations, from which she will greatly profit, for the teeming millions who struggle for a livelihood in the overcrowded territory of the imperial island empire.
7. Because of her confidence that, by the application of force, she will finally compel the assimilation of the 30,000,000 of alien population of Formosa, Shanghai, Mongolia and the islands in the Pacific mandated to her by the Versailles treaty and the League of Nations.
8. Because she will demand the fullest liberty in fortifying the islands now administered by her as a means of defence against any attempt to deprive her of the territory she has illegally seized or to curtail her dire need for expansion.
9. Because of her demand that other nations shall grant racial equality to Japanese subjects, by seeking homes and occupations outside of the imperial Japanese empire.
10. Because of her determination to resist any encroachment by the United States or any other power with which she has not consented to share the trade of Asia and the Pacific through the instrumentality of secret treaties negotiated for mutual advantage.

**Two Sailors Held
For Murder**

BOSTON, Oct. 3.—Two sailors are under arrest here following the murder of John A. McNiff, shoe salesman, in a room at the Atlantic House. McNiff's body was found early today, naked, bound hand and foot with towels and mouth

gagged with a piece of sheet. Two sailors and McNiff had registered for a room under assumed names about two hours before the body was found. McNiff was known to have had money which was not found in the room.

Sailors arrested gave their names to the police as Richard L. Peeler and John A. Stafco, both of the U. S. S. Tacoma.

**DOHERTY WINS
ON ARTICLE X.**

GENEVA, Oct. 4.—The agenda for the closing week of the assembly of the League of Nations comprises such questions as the League's budget and distribution of its expenses and amendments to the covenant.

Hon. Chas. J. Doherty, repre-

senting Canada, has won his fight against rejection of his amendment to the covenant, designed to eliminate Article X. The final conclusion of the committee, which is considered certain the assembly will ratify, is that the amendment deserves careful study and should be held over until the next assembly for further consideration.
