Piusville

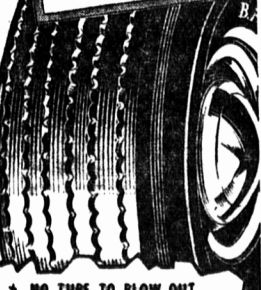

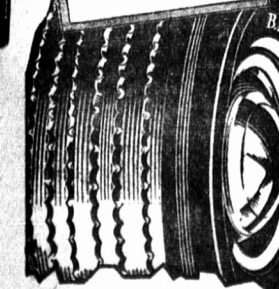
