Beat in 9 unbeaten eggs, one at a time. Add 1/2 teaspoon mace and 1 teaspoon vanilla. Stir in 8 drops rose water or use 2 tablespoons brandy. Sift 4 cups pre-sifted cake flour with 1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar and 1/2 teaspoon salt. Slowly add to first mixture. Mix until thoroughly blended. Stir in 1 cup chopped Macadamia nut meats. Transfer batter to 2 oiled 9-inch by 5 inches loaf pans, smoothly lined with heavy waxed paper. Bake 1 hour in slow oven, 325 degrees F., or until pick inserted in center comes out clean. Turn out on rack after 3 minutes. Leave on waxed paper for easy handling when gift wrapping. Macadamia Nut Cupcake: Follow preceding recipe. Bake in cupcake pans lined with paper baking cups. additions: 1-3 cup halved moist raisins; 1 teaspoon lemon juice; 2 tablespoons chopped nut meats and 1/4 teaspoon melted butter. Top cake with raisin frosting. Raisin frosting: Mix together 2 tablespoons boiling water; 1/4 cups sifted confectioners' sugar; 1/4 teaspoon lemon extract and 1/2 cup chopped raisins. Spread over top of cake. Let stand few hours before cutting. To fancy, decorate to suit with cluster raisins and whole nut meats. True Russian dressing is never sweet in flavor. To prepare, add to 1 cup home-made or commercial mayonnaise 2 tablespoons seasoned tomato sauce, do not use ketchup or chili sauce, as they are too sweet. Stir


1 tablespoon minced chives; spoon black caviar, or if this is not convenient, red caviar and 1 tablespoon diced pimiento. For the climax, add 1 table- substituted for interesting flavor.
