

Music Study Workshop To Open Here On Monday

The various forms of music of whom are well known here at the music festivals, will be discussed at the Workshop Shop at Prince of Wales College starting today. The workshop is sponsored by the P.E.I. Music Festival Association in co-operation of the department of education.

There is scope for a great deal of helpful direction at such a workshop, Christopher Gleibhill, provincial director of music for schools, said this morning. There are discussions on how to produce a good tone, how to deal with backward pupils, how to lead a new song, discussions and demonstrations with recorders, and these are wide instruments mentioned as far back as Handel's time, though they are completely new in this province. Workshops, Mr. Gleibhill explained, are chiefly for the extra class room teacher and there is a tremendous need for the class room teacher to take a more active role in music making. There are only 25 music specialists in the province and there are 450 schools. Charlottetown and Summerside are well manned but there is a great need in the areas outside.

The music director said that the "Singing World Series" was introduced this year that is in books, with records on which are the songs and which were a simple matter of asking pupils to turn to a certain page in the book and sing. From the records and music come from the words by accomplished musicians.
