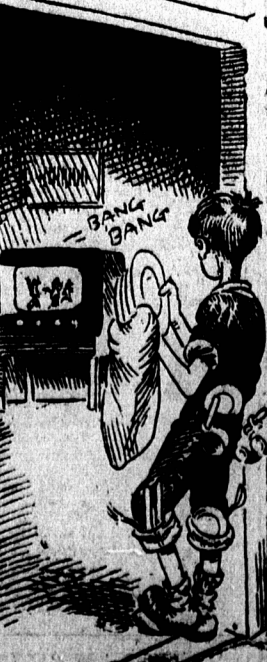

Butcher Fined \$25 For Illegal Sale

SAINT JOHN, March 20 — The first case of illegal sale of meat to appear in city police court under the new by-law, was heard before Magistrate Henneberry. Fred M. McCullum, 56 Wall Street, was sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 with the alternative of one month in jail, when he pleaded guilty. It was pointed out in court that the meat in question was not "bad" meat, but it was meat which had not been inspected before and after slaughter by a federal meat inspector, as the law required. On information by Dr. Forbes MacLeod, dairy and food inspector of the sub-District Board of Health, McCullum was charged with unlawfully offering for sale, two shoulders and other portions of a carcass of veal which had not been inspected and passed as satisfactory. This is contrary to the provisions of Section 2 of the by-law to regulate the slaughter of livestock and the public sale of meat in the city and parishes under an act of the Legislative Assembly. The infraction occurred March 14. According to Dr. MacLeod, the veal sold was actually a choice carcass, but the infraction lay in the fact that it had not been inspected as the law provided. Commenting on the case, Board of Health officials said they felt that such infractions did not occur often. Under the law, they said, all meat sold in the city and county must be inspected by a federal inspector and stamped with the "Canada Approved" label. HUTTERTERS MIGRATE LETHBRIDGE, Alta., March 22 —(CP) — Hutterite migration from Alberta to Mexico is taking form with several colonies already committed to a move, it was learned today. Colonies at Granum, Alta., and Wainwright are reported preparing to move.
