## Detroit Tigers Edge New York Yankees Out Of League Lead

Detroit Tigers Sunday pushed New York Yankees out of first place in the American League—by a scant two points.

Both teams swept doubleheaders but the Tigers emerged a little better on the deal. The Bengals whipped three-place Boston Red Sox 6-2 and 9-6. New York downed St. Louis Browns 1-0 and 4-2. That left Detroit with .696 and New York with .694. Boston is 5 1-2 games behind the leaders.

Southpaw Ted Gray of Detroit pitched four-hit ball for nine innings in the overtime nightcap against Boston, although the Sox scored freely. The teams were deadlocked 6-6 from the seventh until the 14th when Vic Wertz hit a three-run homer to win for the Tigers.

A seven-run, seventh-inning rally gave Philadelphia Athletics a 9-6 nightcap win over Cleveland Indians. Tenth-inning home runs by Al Rosen and Jim Hegan—the latter's with a man on base—gave Cleveland a 6-3 first-game decision.

New York's Fred Sanford won his fourth victory in the second half against the last-place Browns, allowing only four hits and farming nine. The three-hit pitching of Vic Raschi gave the Yanks the opener.

Chicago White Sox turned the tables on Washington Senators by winning a double feature 8-3 and 5-4. The Senators previously had beaten the White Sox seven consecutive times. The twin-victory moved Chicago into sixth place ahead of St. Louis and Philadelphia.

Chicago clipped Steve Nagy for four runs in the first inning of

the opener and coasted to victory behind the nine-hit pitching of Ken Holcombe.

### SATURDAY'S GAMES

Detroit Tigers took over the top rung in the American League from the losing New York Yankees by totalling 21 hits for 31 bases to crush Boston Red Sox 18-8 Saturday.

The Yankees bowed 7-2 to St. Louis Browns who had not advanced a runner to third base when they came to bat in the eighth. But the Browns ran up five runs against Allie Reynolds in that inning and two more in the ninth.

Cuban rookie Sandalia Consuegra made his major-league debut with a 6-0 victory for Washington Senators over Chicago White Sox in a rain-shortened 4 1-2-inning game.

Philadelphia's southpaw, Lou Brissie suffered his eighth defeat of the season as Cleveland Indians rolled to a 7-3 victory over the Athletics.

In the National League, St. Louis Cardinals moved away from Brooklyn Dodgers into undisputed possession of the league's first place by dumping New York Giants into a 6-2 defeat.

Cincinnati's Ted Kluszewski bashed a hom run over the center-field barrier in the last of the ninth to help the Redskins to a 4-3 victory over the Dodgers.

Chicago Cubs defeated Boston Braves 13-10 in a 20-hit slugfest to snap a three-day losing streak.

Philadelphia Phillies at Pittsburgh Pirates was rained out.

## Three Are Indicted In New York For Espionage

NEW YORK, June 10—(AP)—Harry Gold, 39-year-old Philadelphia chemist, and two unidentified persons, were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury on charges of feeding atom-bomb secrets to the Russians.

Gold was accused of operating as an intermediary between Dr. Klaus Fuchs, the convicted British scientist, and members of a wartime Soviet A-bomb spy ring.

In addition to Gold, the indictment named "John Doe, alias 'John' and Richard Roe, alias 'Sam'." The "true and correct names" of these persons, the indictment said, are unknown to the jury.

The unidentified "John Doe"

was named as the Soviet agent who transmitted atomic secrets to Russia after allegedly having received them from Gold. Gold, in turn, was accused of getting these documents from Fuchs during a series of meetings in the U.S.

The indictment, by naming "Richard Roe" as a defendant in the purported spy plot, injected another mysterious figure into the alleged wartime traffic in top secret documents. There was no further indication as to his real identity.

Gold, a native of Switzerland who came to the U.S. with his parents in 1914, was arrested in Philadelphia last May 23. He could be given the death sentence if convicted of wartime spying.

Federal Bureau of Investigation agents said they traced him through leads supplied by Fuchs, now in a British prison after admitting he gave atomic secrets to the Soviets. Fuchs is the former head of Britain's atomic development program.

Playing like a machine, Hogan ripped around the east course in 36-33.

Mangrum, 1946 champion from Niles, Ill., had 36-37-73, losing his chance for the title when he was given a two-stroke penalty for clearing his ball on the 16th green.

At that stage, he was only one stroke back of the wiry Texan, whose career of winning championships was interrupted by a near-fatal auto accident 17 months ago.

## WEED CONTROL ASSISTANCE

Farm producers are hereby advised that the Provincial Department of Agriculture will render assistance in the purchase of 2-4-D for the control of Wild Radish, Mustard, and other obnoxious weeds, on the following basis:

Fifty per cent of the cost of either powder or liquid 2-4-D, but not to exceed fifty (50) cents per pound for powder or three dollars and eighty-five cents (\$3.85) per gallon for liquid.

Payment will be made direct to the farm purchaser on presentation of a fully signed and receipted statement from the dealer or seller covering quantities purchased and the cost of the material.

Farmers are advised that, if they apply this weed killer from potato sprayers, it is very important that the sprayers be thoroughly washed using a solution comprised of One pint of household ammonia to each twenty-five gallons of water. The solution should be allowed to remain in the tank for a day or so, then operate the sprayer to wash nozzles and boom. The balance of solution may be drained and tank thoroughly rinsed.
