

# More S.U. Expenditures - Except For Bartenders

General meeting - discussion - Brian Howatt stated that at the best, the auditors report would be available, at the earliest, in June. Other executive members voiced the opinion that, during the last weeks of classes, students would be very busy with exams & papers. However, the Constitution of Student Union states that we must hold a spring general meeting. Therefore, it was agreed that a Council Meeting & General Meeting would be held in conjunction with

each other on April 6th at 6:30 p.m. in Duffy Amphitheatre.

On Tuesday, there will be a meeting on the idea of compiling a Student Calendar. The meeting will be held in the Student Union Offices at 7 p.m. All interested students are asked to attend as a student calendar involves about 10,000 questionnaires and a great amount of work in collecting the data and compiling it into a useful calendar.

The re-opening of an

Internal Advertising position was discussed. This position would mainly involve the making of posters to advertise events on campus. It was decided that the person chosen for this position would be paid by salary or honorarium. The amount was to be decided at a later council meeting.

Ray Shalala reported on attending what he felt was a rather disorganized meeting of the Residence Council Committee. In his opinion, he felt that the Committee was far too de-

pendent on Student Services and suggested that perhaps they should become a sub-committee of Student Union. Council felt that they were not well enough informed to make a decision on this matter so it was tabled.

The matter of Clyde Bell's maintenance supervision of the Barn, was discussed. The figure of \$125.00 a week was discussed. There was some disagreement as to what Clyde was making at the present time. Therefore, it was tabled until the next meeting. The raise will take effect on April 1st. Also, part-time cleaning staff was placed under the direct supervision of Mr. Bell; giving him the power to hire & fire all part-time cleaners.

The matter of buying 15 jackets and armbands for the Campus Police was discussed. The maximum amount to be spent was set at \$400. The vote was close and there were several abstentions but the proposal was approved.

The matter of hiring student police was discussed. Personnel Board recommended 15 people for positions. The matter was discussed at length and the names of those hired and not accepted was tabled by Craig MacDowell. A motion was made that the Personnel Board recommendations be accepted. The Chief of Campus Police will be chosen by a joint decision of the Campus Police & the Personnel Board. The 15 people chosen by the Personnel Board were accepted by Council.

In other business, Gordon Campbell brought up what he called the "ridiculous" amount of money paid out to bartenders and ticket sellers at the Pig n' Whistles at the Gym. The total expense at the Molly Oliver performance was 2 people at \$20 for ticket sellers, and two people at \$30 for bartenders. Also, the topic of paying \$150 to rent our own gym was discussed. It was moved that the Personnel review salaries of all paid personnel at such functions with the understanding that present pay scales were in the present council's opinion, too high.

The matter of Student Union Scholarships for Students doing considerable work on a volunteer basis for Student Union was brought up by Donna McLaughlin and Brian Howatt. It was approved by council. Following this the meeting was adjourned.
