FOR CAMERA MEN.

One of our most successful amateur photographers is Mr. Harry Stirling of this city. We have been shown a number of pictures taken by him, and they are all most clearly defined and distinct. Some winter views taken during the time of the "deep snow" are particularly good. Mr. Stirling uses a Rochester Optical Co.'s camera, which seems to be the favorite in Charlottetown. Some of the advantages claimed for these cameras are portability, quality of lens and simplicity.

THE MARKETS.

There was a fair attendance at the market to-day. There was a good deal of pork on sale, changing hands at from 5 1/2 to 5 3/4 cents per lb. One porker, weighing 273 lbs., was sold to Saunders & Campbell for 5 1/2 cents per lb., and another, brought in by a man named Younker, which tipped the scales at 567 lbs., was bought by Mr. Seiler at a similar figure. We quote prices of other articles as follows: Eggs, 18 to 20c; butter (fresh) 20 to 22c; butter (tub) 18 to 19c; turkeys, 80c. to \$1.50; geese, 60 to 70c; fowl, 45 to 55c; duck, 60 to 70c; oats, 34 to 35c; hay, 70 to 80c.

MEDICAL LECTURES.

Dr. H. D. Johnson gave the first of a course of lectures on Osteology which he intends delivering before the medical students of the city last evening. The Doctor's opening remarks consisted of a brief general consideration of the subject, in which he pointed out the necessity of students being well grounded in the introductory part of the constructions of bone, before considering their development, and the periods of ossification. It is understood that the whole course of lectures will be on this subject. Dr. Warton has kindly consented to give a course on Pathology, beginning on Tuesday next.

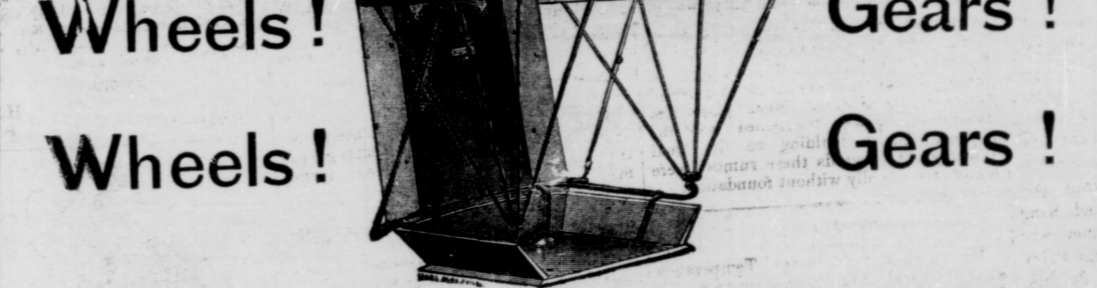
