Continued from page 11) usually in short fleshy roots. During the next spring they draw on the stored food to produce a vigorous vegetative growth and to produce seeds. Burdock, bull thistle and wild parsnip are biennial weeds.

Perennial weeds live for more than two years. The majority of perennials possess root crowns that produce new plants year after year, being supported by a fleshy taproot or by means of fibrous roots. Field bindweed, perennial sowthistle and whitetop spread by horizontal roots, while couch grass spreads by rootstocks.

Weeds lower yields by using soil nutrients and moisture. An important control method is early and frequent cultivation of the land. Weeds are killed most easily when they are seedlings. Another important feature in controlling growing annual weeds is to keep them from going to seed by early mowing, especially in pastures and along fences or roadsides where cultivation is impossible.

Crop rotation is a valuable aid in weed control because many weeds are associated with certain crops. Continuous culture of one crop makes the control of these associated weeds difficult.

All types of community farm machinery, particularly small grain cleaners, combines, and hay balers should be cleaned before they are brought to the farm.

In recent years the control of weeds through the use of chemical herbicides has expanded

remarkably. The ideal herbicide is one that is nonpoisonous, easily applied, effective in the control of various species at a minimum expense, and without permanent injury to the soil. 2, 4-D and MCP are the ones most commonly used but new sprays should be used with caution until they are found to be thoroughly safe and satisfactory.

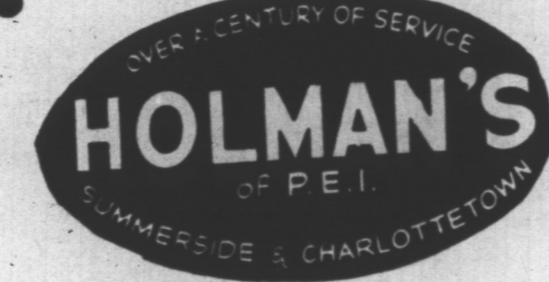
