Dawn Ceremony As Pakistan Becomes Republic

KARACHI (Reuters) — Pakistan became an Islamic Republic Friday in a solemn, dawn ceremony on the lawns of Government House as envoys of 35 nations attended. Bewigged Chief Justice Monaham Mirza gave the oath of office to tall, soldierly Maj.-Gen. Iskander Mirza, who became the first president.

Pakistan, as a republic inside the British Commonwealth, now has a status equivalent to that of India.

A few hours after the ceremony, President Mirza told Pakistan's 80,000,000 people in a radio broadcast:

"The territorial integrity of Pakistan will always remain an inviolable article of faith for us."

Before the inauguration ceremony, President Mirza sat in a gilt chair next to his wife, the Iranian-born Begum Naheed Iskander Mirza, who wore a light blue sari.

They were flanked by red-coated

bodyguards wearing gold and blue turbans.

The president and his first lady drove to the ceremony in a black and gold open coach.

As 500 distinguished guests, including T. C. Davis, Canadian ambassador to Japan, looked on from 30 flower-decked canopies, a recitation was read from the Koran and Chief Justice Mirza proclaimed the republic.

Farm Value Of Maple Products

OTTAWA (CP) —The gross farm value of Canadian maple products declined in 1955 to \$10,822,000 from \$11,038,000 in the previous year but was well above the 1948-52 average of \$9,807,000.

The bureau of statistics reports the year's output in terms of syrup declined to 2,231,000 gallons from 2,422,000 in 1954 and the 1948-52 average of 2,728,000.

Gross farm value of maple syrup by province with last year's figures in brackets: Quebec \$9,392,000 (\$9,315,000); Ontario \$972,000 (\$1,100,000); New Brunswick \$52,000 (\$51,000); Nova Scotia \$24,000 (\$17,000).

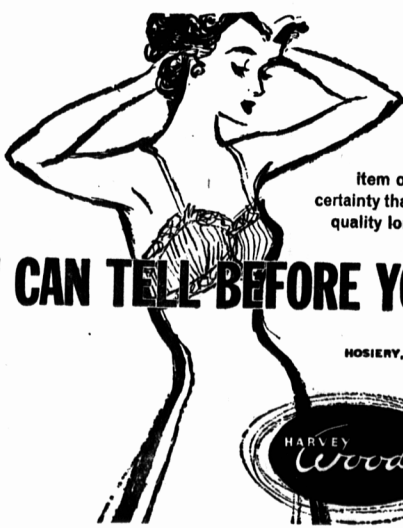

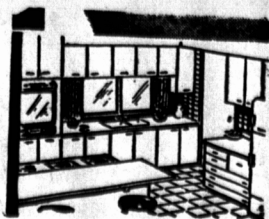
