### Tid Bits From Here And There

Rogers Rangers with Forbie Kennedy handling the reins in the absence of Norman (Hawk) Larner bounced back from the brink of elimination at the Charlottetown Forum, Wednesday night, to blast the PWC Welshmen 7-0 and square their best of three series at one game apiece. The Rangers pumped in two goals at the opening frame and never looked back as they led 5-0 at the end of the second and added two in the final period. John Reid recorded the first shut-out of the year in the Charlottetown and District junior loop in the Ranger cage.

Charlottetown Rural Regional High School slipped Queen Charlotte High School 4-3 in an interscholastic game played at the Charlottetown Forum, Wednesday. The Rural high school, Queen Charlotte and Birchwood are engaged in a round robin series to determine who will get the bye in the playoffs. The team with the best standing after the series will have the bye and the other two teams will play off to decide which one advances to the finals.

Stan Mikita continued to set the pace for the Windy City entry in the National Hockey League as he fired his 26th goal of the season against the Detroit Red Wings Wednesday night to help the Billy Reay coached aggregation defeat the Wings by a 3-2 count. In other National League action Henry Richard fired the first 'hat trick' of the season in the 'big time', to pace the Montreal Canadiens to a 6-1 victory over the lowly New York Rangers.

Billy MacMillan of St. Dunstan's Saints is on top in the individual scoring race in the Maritime Intercollegiate Hockey League. Official figures released from Halifax Wednesday show MacMillan with 39 points on 17 goals and 13 assists. Cal Chi Farenza of St. Francis Xavier X-Men is next with 28 points on 14 goals and 14 assists. Gary McQuid of St. FX and Ivan Velan of Mount Allison are tied for third position with 24 points apiece.

Oscar Bonavena of Buenos Aires, undefeated in eight fights, will kick his streak tonight at Madison Square Garden when he meets Zora Polley, the world's fifth-ranked heavyweight in a 10-round bout. Bonavena, who is listed among the top 10, will be facing the strongest test of his 13-month career. The 23-year-old Argentine heavyweight has not lost a bout since he turned professional Jan. 3, 1964. He began his career by knocking out Louis Hicks in the first round.

Oscar Gaudet's goal at the 7:21 mark of the third period earned a 6-5 victory for the Buffalo Bisons over the Quebec Aces in American Hockey League action Wednesday night. Gaudet is a former star of the Nova Scotia Senior Hockey League where he performed for Moncton representatives in what is now the Maritime Senior Hockey League.

# Manitoba Rink Captures Women's Curling Ch'ship

HALIFAX (CP)—Peggy Casselman's Manitoba rink from Winnipeg won the Canadian women's curling championship here Thursday by defeating Alberta 7-5 in the final round of the national bonspiel.

The Manitoba foursome captured the Dominion Diamond "D" trophy by piling up a 6-0 lead over Dorothy Thompson of Edmonton after four ends and holding off the Alberta rink for the rest of the match. The two teams were deadlocked at seven wins apiece going into the final draw Thursday night.

Manitoba opened with a single counter in the first end and added two more in each of the second and third. Mrs. Casselman's quartet boosted the margin with one counter in the fourth.

Alberta answered with two points in each of the fifth and sixth ends to pull within two counters of the lead, but Manitoba picked up the insurance margin with another single in the eighth.

HALIFAX (CP)—Alberta and Manitoba swept to convening eighth-round victories in the Canadian women's curling championship here Thursday and the luck of the draw pitted the two bonspiel leaders in a final duel Thursday night.

Both rinks had seven wins and only one loss going into the ninth round at 7:30 p.m. AST. Dorothy Thompson's Edmonton team advanced to the showdown match by trouncing Nova Scotia 11-2, while Peggy Casselman's Winnipeg foursome humiliated Newfoundland by a 17-5 score.

Solange Larouche of Dolbeau, Que., held on for a 9-8 win against Sybil MacMillan's

Prince Edward Island rink from Charlottetown, and New Brunswick, skipped by Joan Callaghan of Bathurst, walloped Lesley Cmolik of Kelowna, B.C. 12-4 in their eighth-round games. Saskatchewan, represented by Barbara MacNevin's Delta quartet, shattered Ontario's hopes for a finish any higher than third place when it handed Fern Irwin's Toronto team a 10-5 setback.
