Canada had no part in this record wreckage but turned up a couple of aces for the day in Jack Hutchins of Vancouver, a heat winner in the 800-metre preliminaries, and little Armand Bernard of Montreal, winner in the opening round of the featherweight wrestling competition.

Bill Farrell of North Vancouver also qualified for Monday's 800-metre semi-final by placing third in his heat. John Ross of Oakville, Ont., was a fourth-place finisher and missed qualifying.
