Workers Leave As Fire Erupts
MONTREAL (CP) — About 400 customers and 300 employees were quietly evacuated from the seven-story Ogilvy's department store here Thursday when a small fire erupted in a third floor stock room. The store closed for the day, but an official said it would reopen today as usual. Cause of the fire was not known. There was no immediate estimate of losses although eyewitnesses said there was more smoke and water than fire damage. The flames burned through a number of cardboard cartons used for shipping and ate into wood partitions near the sporting goods department. Parts of the third-floor were covered with three inches of water.

Reds Renew Treaty Call

Russia's last proposal for such a pact came in formal notes to Britain, the United States and France Dec. 13 on the eve of a NATO council meeting in Paris. This time the proposal was repeated in a government statement issued by the official news agency Tass. HALIFAX (CP) — Nova Scotia Technical College said here Thursday it would bestow honorary doctor of engineering degrees on Dr. Alan E. Cameron of Ottawa and J. H. Mowbray Jones of Corner Brook, Nfld., at its 50th convocation exercises. Dr. Cameron is a past-president of the college and a member of the Canadian engineering team which made a survey of engineering education in Indonesia under the Colombo Plan in 1956. Mr. Jones, a former deputy-mayor of Liverpool, N.S., is president of Bowater's Mersey Paper Company Limited at Liverpool, N.S., and Bowater's Newfoundland Pulp and Paper Mills Limited at Corner Brook.

Building Fund Is Far Advanced
MONTREAL (CP) — The University of New Brunswick building fund is well over half way to its \$3,200,000 goal and the end now is in sight, says Vernon E. Johnson, chairman of the drive. Public subscriptions have passed \$1,000,000 and the New Brunswick government is matching them dollar for dollar. Business and industry in Quebec has donated \$400,000 so far, said Mr. Johnson, president of the Canadian International Paper Company. Twenty five per cent of the university's student body comes from Quebec and Ontario.
