Barnstorming Tour Planned Of Latin America

OTTAWA, Nov. 8-(CP)—Trade Minister Howe and a group of Canadian industrialists will undertake a five-week, 15,000-mile barnstorming tour of nine Latin-American countries next January to consolidate and expand Canadian trade gains in that area.

The Trade Department Friday announced that the Canadian trade mission—the first undertaken by a cabinet minister in six years—will leave Jan. 5, returning Feb. 10.

Countries to be visited include Brazil, Argentina, Uruguay, Venezuela, Colombia, the Dominican Republic, Haiti, Cuba and Mexico. This is the first time Mr. Howe visits South America as Canadian trade minister, but actually he will be revisiting old stamping grounds. He planned and built some of the biggest grain elevators in the Argentine as a commercial engineer, long before he went into politics 17 years ago.

With him will be a group of Toronto industrialists, as well as a Quebec co-operative official and a representative of the Canadian Wheat Board.

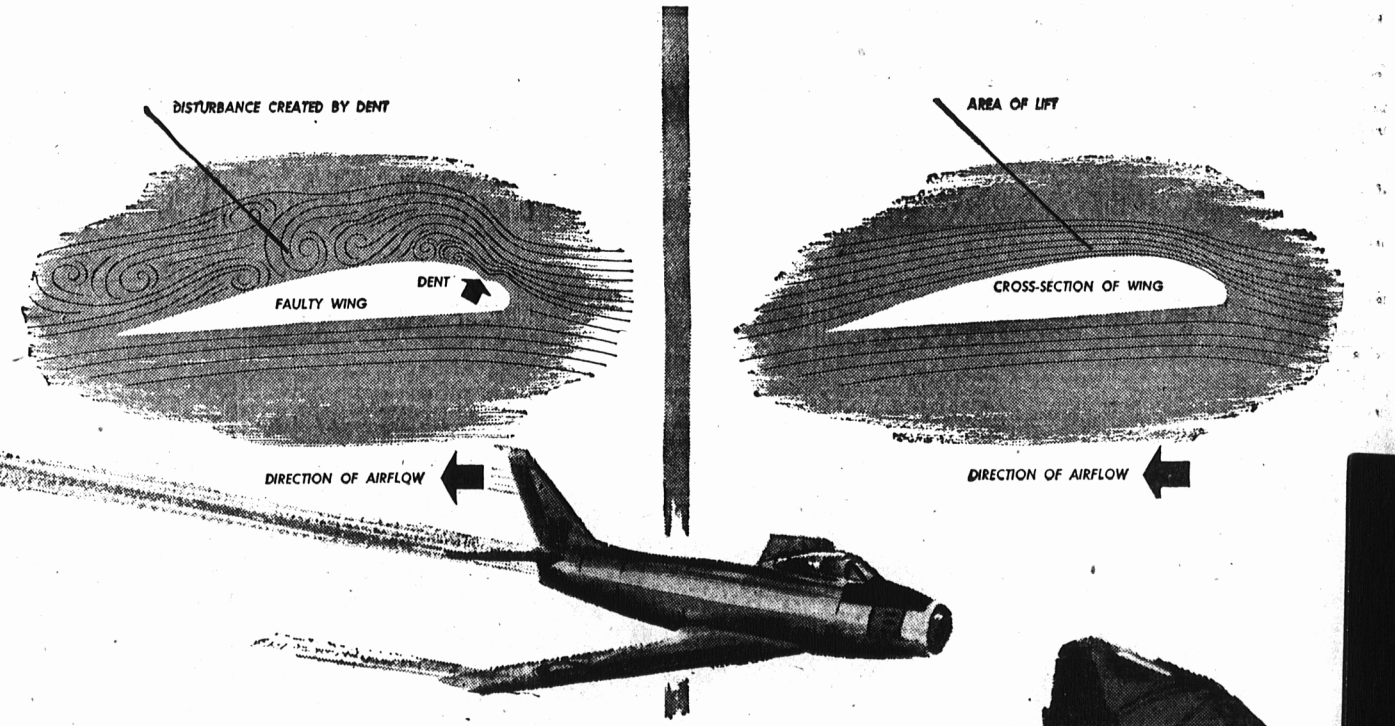
