Slight Drop In Production Of Steel In U.S.

CLEVELAND (AP)—Steel magazine blames wildcat strikes and furnace repairs for a one-point drop last week in steel production.

The rate declined to 98.5 per cent of rated capacity production. Four U. S. producers were hit by strikes, and the metal-working weekly says the walkouts may indicate a tough struggle ahead in the steel negotiations which begin in June.

"Such wildcat strikes often come just before labor negotiations, but this year they are earlier than usual," the magazine says.

Production at near capacity rates was taking its toll of furnace life. "Enough furnaces were off last week for repairs to trim back the operating rates in several districts."

Steel says a buyers' market has returned to one district, New England, where production has been dropping all year to the present 82 per cent of capacity.

In that district, production of sheet and other flat-rolled tonnage with the exception of cold-rolled silicon strip, is exceeding demand. Some customers are asking that shipments be deferred to July and August.

However, the New England situation is not typical of the rest of the country, Steel says, adding that "many barometers indicate a strong demand for steel will continue."

The magazine's composite price on finished steel held steady at \$128.02 per net ton last week. Scrap prices rose to \$49.83 a gross ton from \$49.17 the previous week.

New Shipping Firm Formed

MONTREAL (CP)—Canadian Overseas Shipping (1956) Limited has been formed under the presidency of Mr. James P. Boyle to handle the agencies of two steamship services operating from Europe to the St. Lawrence and Great Lakes ports. The lines are the Oranje Line, of Rotterdam, and the Fjell Line, of Oslo, it was announced today.

The Oranje Line was formerly handled by Shipping Limited and the Fjell Line by J. Brock shipping company inc. The regular staffs formerly handling the two lines will form the new organization.

Shipping Limited will continue to operate as general freight and chartering brokers, vessel agent and agents for Irish Shipping Limited. J. Brock Shipping Company will continue to act as shipping agents.

M. P. Questions Gov't Purchase Of Old Masters

Ottawa (Special)—Back from his R. A. F. training assignment course at Uplands Airport near here, J. Angus MacLean, Conservative Member for Queens, questioned the wisdom of the Government in spending \$885,000 for four paintings.

Mr. MacLean confessed that he is no expert on old masters or painting in general but he felt the question of buying these paintings was of a double-barreled nature. "Is the Government paying high prices for these paintings because of their real artistic merit or simply because paintings of this kind are scarce," he asked.

Cost of old stamps and old coins are high not because of any artistic merit but merely because they are rare. Mr. MacLean did not believe the National Gallery should be an agency for acquiring articles only on account of their rarity.

It is believed the ship struck a submerged object. Earlier this month the Bluenose was out of service more than a week while undergoing repairs at a Saint John, N.B. drydock.

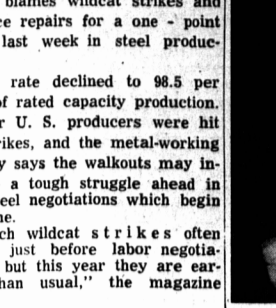
Mr. Wright said the works department made a three-day check of Yarmouth harbor but failed to find any underwater obstructions. He said another check will be made.
