A NEW DEPARTURE.

AFTER much thought and discussion, the United States have at length annexed Hawaii. This deliberate act indicates that the Republic has decided to abandon the Monroe Doctrine, which limited her possessions to the territory of North America, and to become a Great Power in the world.

RAILWAY MATTERS.

COPIES of the Intercolonial Railway time-table are not yet to be had. The matter is a small one. But it is important. Moreover, it shows that the inefficiency of the Minister of Railways is spreading to branches of the service.

The letter of Mr. W. C. Harris, Jr., published today, deserves attention. Railway authorities never have shown much regard for continuity of travel between this province and the mainland.

An accident such as that which caused the delay on Wednesday last, of which Mr. Harris complains, is exceptional, and the results of accidents have to be endured. But we think that the railway authorities ought to put on a special train to connect with the steamer whenever she is upwards of two hours late, and to be permitted to allow the regular express to come through on time for the convenience of local passengers.

Speaking of the gold mines of the Sierra Leone region, a well-known West African colonist recently said: "It is only of late years that a revival has set in, and the Gio Fin and Wassau Mines have made some headway against the fallacious reports of overwhelming difficulties."
