NEWFOUNDLAND ELECTIONS.

Further Returns Increase Probability of the Government's Defeat.

Large Gains by the Opposition.

St. John's, Nfld., Nov. 2.—The White-way ministry is defeated and will probably resign by the end of the month. At the time this despatch is sent full returns have not yet been received but there is no doubt that the opposition has secured nineteen out of thirty-six seats. White-way, the premier, has been defeated by 852 votes; Scott, the Receiver General, has been beaten by 700; Woods, the Surveyor General, has been defeated by 400 votes; Tait, the Medical Director, has been defeated by 1000 votes.

Sir James Winler, leader of the opposition, has carried Urin District by a majority of two to one over his ministerial opponent, and the opposition majorities throughout the Colony are in most cases very large.

In Trinity, the Opposition vote two to one; in Bonavita the Opposition vote three to one. Bay St. George goes to the Opposition. Sir William White-way and Hon. Mr. Wood, two of the Executive are defeated. On the other hand Messrs. Morris and Howard of the Executive Council are elected.

The count of the votes at Placentia has just commenced. The Opposition is leading there so far.

It will be noted that this table gives the return of 29 members out of the total 36 for the whole colony, and that of these 29 members elect, 12 are supporters of the Government and 17 belong to the Opposition.
Of the constituencies not yet heard from, the Opposition held a majority in the last House.
