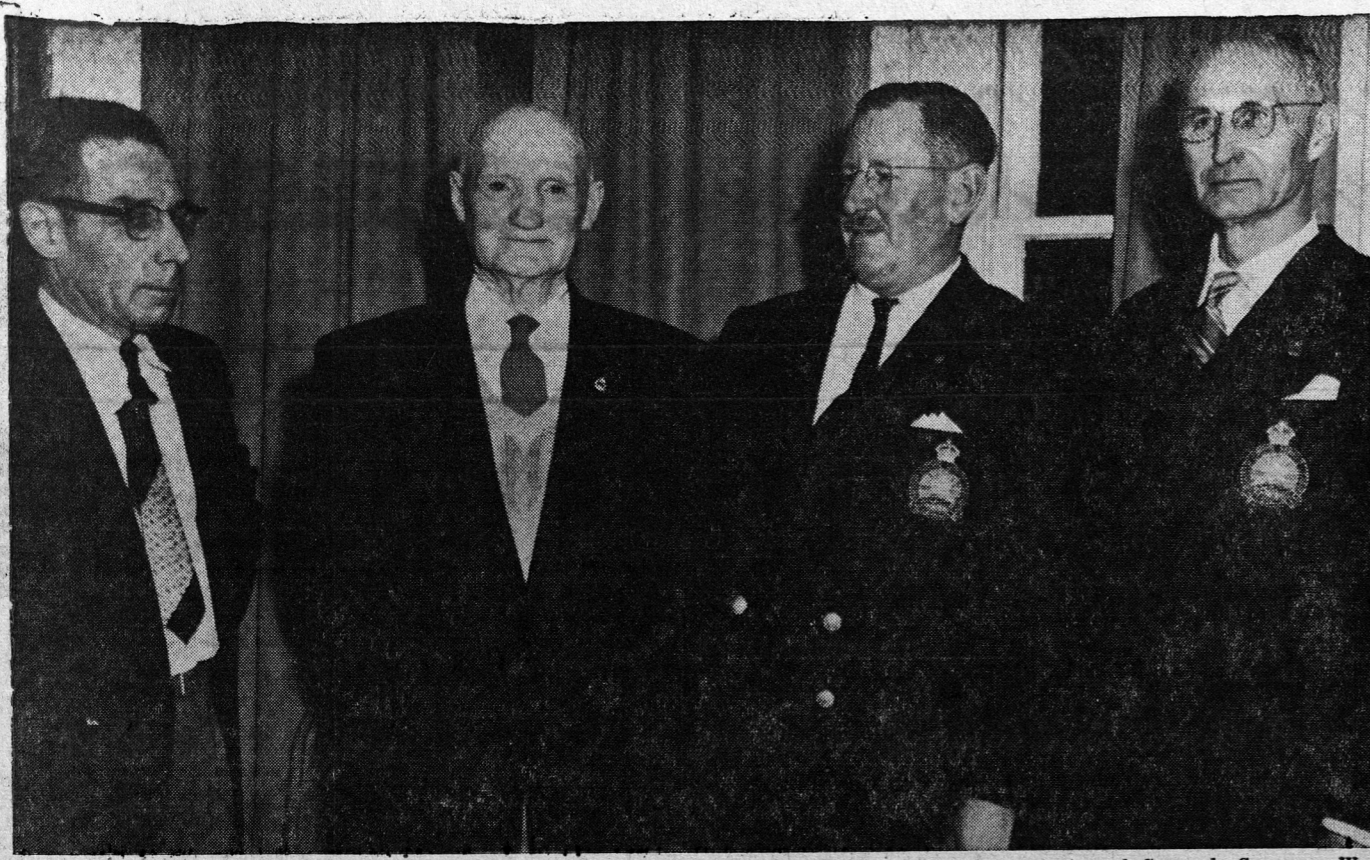

Pearson Takes First Step To Mobilize Party
OTTAWA (CP)—Liberal Leader Lester B. Pearson Thursday took the first step in setting up a special election committee to mobilize party organization for the next election campaign.

He announced appointment of Senator John J. Connolly, 51-year-old Ottawa lawyer, as its chairman and said other members will be appointed within the next few days after consultation with provincial representatives.

Mr. Pearson's office said it is not yet known how many members will be named to the committee.

The move is in line with a resolution adopted at the recent national Liberal convention which said there is an urgent need for immediate mobilization of party forces "because of the imminence of a federal election."

The convention resolution said the special committee should function continuously throughout the campaign, holding regional and provincial meetings "when and if required by the exigencies of the campaign."

Senator Connolly, who was chairman of the convention's program committee, was named to the Senate in 1955. During the Second World War he was executive assistant to the late Angus L. Macdonald, then navy minister and later premier of Nova Scotia.
