He came through with this opinion:

The Platooning System

LOS ANGELES manager, Walter Alton, has come under criticism for his platooning method.

Arguing against the critics of platooning is Paul Richards, probably the oddest manager in the majors today.

Richards insists he never found a left-handed hitter who likes to hit against a left-handed pitcher. Paul says they may learn to hit them but they don't like their work. The Houston boss maintains it's more difficult for a left-handed to hit a southpaw than it is for a right handed batter to hit a right handed pitcher. Paul claims this may be so because some of the other players go to so few left-handers as youngsters.

BUT Richards adds that this is not the only reason. "The other guy likes to play too," says Paul.

"If you're going to give him a chance there is no reason for not taking advantage of the pitching percentage. I used Walt Droppo at first against Minnesota. He pitched a left hander. After Jim Gentile had knocked in seven runs in a doubleheader the day before, I wouldn't always do it. I wanted to see if he could do it again. I again, I wanted to use Droppo and that seemed a good time."

America's Cup Entry Is Seen For First Time

MARBLEHEAD, Mass. (AP) — The mystery America's Cup entry was seen by reporters for the first time Wednesday.

If the yacht is as fast as she is beautiful, she will be a hard nut to beat.

Twenty women are finishing painting the sleek mahogany hull of the yet-unnamed yacht, which will attempt to become the United States defender of the Cup. It is scheduled for launching Saturday midnight.

The concept of the new 12-member skipper is one of a lighter design. It was discussed at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Tuesday night by co-skipper Don McNameara at a seminar of the Yacht Racing Union of Massachusetts.

The program included talks by designer Ted Hood, builder E. Reiman Graves, and E. Ross Anderson, head of the syndicate which owns the craft.

The yacht, built in secrecy, has a 13-foot beam—a foot wider than Australian defender Gretel and more than a foot and quarter wider than the other existing U.S. yachts that will compete in the America's Cup trials.

Her displacement will be roughly 57,000 pounds compared with Columbia's 59,300 and Gretel's 60,000.

The America's Cup races are scheduled to start off Newport, R.I., Sept. 15.

Giants Whip Cards 7-2; Mets, Twins Grab Wins

St. Louis tied the National League career hit record Wednesday but league-leading San Francisco Giants unleashed its power to beat St. Louis Cardinals.

The 41-year-old Cardinal outfielder singlesthrusted right centre off winning pitcher Jim Marichal in the sixth inning for a clutch hit, tying Homey Wagner's standard.

Britain Joins Rest of World On Boxing Rule
