Traffic Cases Heard In Court At Summerside

Fines of \$10 for leaving the scene of an accident, and \$10 for driving without a licence, were penalties imposed on a Rose Valley man, while a \$25 fine for "joy-riding" was asked of a sailor from H.M.C.S. Algonquin when the two men appeared before Magistrate E. H. Strong Tuesday in Summerside Police Court following two separate incidents the previous evening which left four vehicles with varying degrees of damage.

The joy-riding charge against the sailor, from the visiting ship, was the sequel to the theft of a car owned by John MacCausland, a visiting tourist from New York state, who left his car momentarily to enter a store on Water Street.

Police were notified of the car theft and a radio message to the patrol car proceeding eastward on Water Street West was received by the patrol only moments before they were forced off the highway to avoid being struck by the stolen car which was proceeding westward in a dangerous manner.

Immediately behind the patrol was a 1956 Pontiac driven by Harold Robins, a salesman from the mainland, whose car was extensively damaged when it took the full force of the collision which the police patrol had so narrowly missed. The stolen car was also damaged by the crash, and the driver was taken into custody by the police.

While no "joy" was experienced by the owners of the smashed cars, the charge was one of "joy-riding", with a \$25 fine imposed by Magistrate Strong.

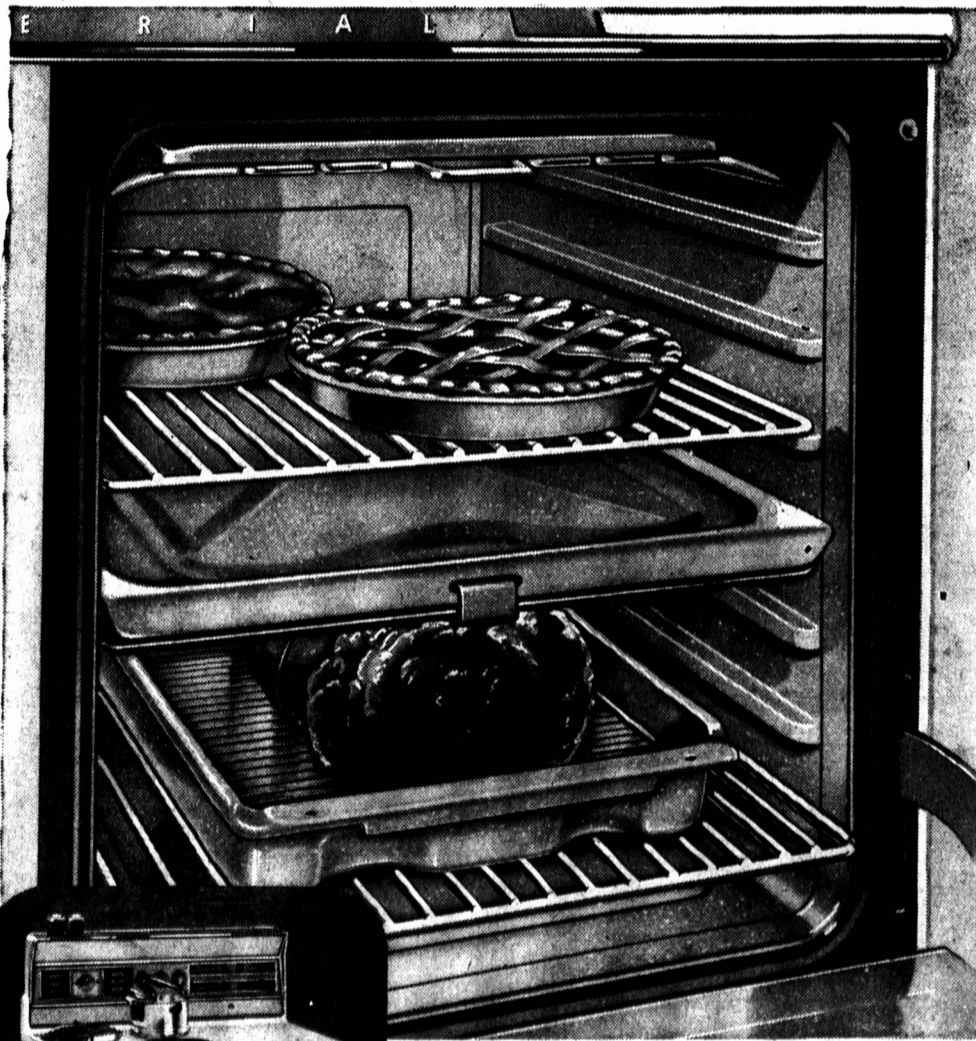

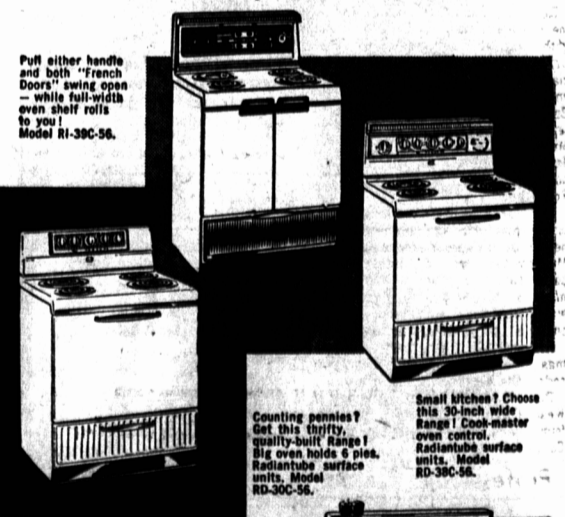
