DOMINION PARLIAMENT.

Liquor License.

OTTAWA, April 23.

The Liquor License sub-Committee on Saturday passed a resolution limiting the number of taverns to four for the first thousand inhabitants in towns, and one to each subsequent four hundred inhabitants; one shop license for each four hundred to twelve hundred, and one for each subsequent thousand. In country districts the board may license a number, but no license will be granted where other goods than liquors are sold. They also move that the majority of electors in a district have power to prevent the granting of a license.

Conspiracy to Murder.

DUBLIN, April 23.

Twenty arrests of parties charged with conspiring to murder, have been made at Milltown. The information of the conspirators' whereabouts was given to the authorities by an informer.

The Dublin Mansion House Committee have issued an appeal to the Irish race throughout the world in behalf of a testimonial to Parnell.

Sueliman Pasha Dead.

CONSTANTINOPLE, April 23.

Sueliman Pasha, one of the active and able Turkish generals, who took a prominent part in the Russo-Turkish war, died yesterday.

Grand Duchess Theresa, of Leichtenberg, is dead.

Herr Hermann Schulz Delitzsch, the celebrated German political economist, is dying.

A fire at New Orleans, on the 11th, burned out several business firms. The loss aggregates \$200,000.

The thieves who broke into the vaults where the Government deposits its stamps at Havana, have stolen stamped paper to the value of nearly \$28,000.

Extensive conflagration occurred in Delhi, India, on the 19th. Two thousand houses were destroyed and a great number of families are destitute and homeless.

Sir John Rose writes to the London Times urging England to invite all civilized nations to unite in securing the enactment of laws for the extradition of any person who shall commit atrocities under the veil of a political motive.

A collision occurred off Bilbo, on the 19th, between the English steamer "Thames" and the Spanish steamer "Magdalena Vincenta." The latter sunk with five on board. Two of the crew of the "Thames" were drowned.

The Pall Mall Gazette says the evidence that the dynamite plots now under investigation were hatched in New York is as clear as the proof the foreign police possessed twenty five years ago that Mazzini's plots against Italy were hatched in England, and says the extradition of Rosa from the United States is about as likely as Mazzini's was from England.

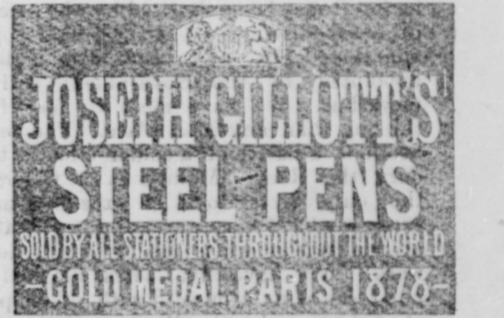
