SCOTT ACT CASES.

The Evidence Taken.

ARTHUR WHITE (sworn).—I cannot say how often I have had beer at McVay's. I have had beer there more than once. I don't know if I got liquor there every time I was in. I got it four or five times. I can't tell the difference between whiskey and rum. I got the liquor from McVay. Never paid him a cent for liquor. He gives it to me. That is straight. I did not leave as much as \$5 cash with him. I left about 50 cents there. I gave the money to McVay himself. I gave the money for cigars. I wear them to the best of my recollection. He did not treat me when he got the cigars. I am no relative of McVay's. I am no relative of his wife. I do not know why he should give me treats for nothing. I got liquor there to-day.

Magistrate—What do you do when you go in?

Witness—I do nothing.
