MRS. F. W. DAVISON

On March 22nd, Mrs. F. W. Davison, widow of the late Mr. Davison, passed away in the Curran Nursing Home, Roslyn Road, Manitoba.

Let's Talk It Over

Most people have read of the much discussed criminal case in England in which Derek Bentley, a 19-year old boy, was sentenced to be hanged because, while being held by the police, he urged Christopher Craig, his 16-year old accomplice in a robbery to "let them have it" and Craig responded by killing a policeman. Craig, because of his age, was not condemned to die.

It is perhaps presumptuous for the ordinary layman to question decisions rendered by men whose experience in the realm of jurisprudence has been long and distinguished, and there is little doubt that both sentences conform to the laws of the land. Some of the facts of the case, however, seem significant. For instance, it is said that Craig dominated Bentley. Also, that Bentley was slow-witted, and had been rejected by the army because he could not pass the lowest intelligence tests. Now doesn't it appear that though Bentley was 19, and Craig was 16, Bentley's "mental age" was much lower than that of Craig?

What we don't understand is why "mental ages" are not the deciding factor in determining guilt and punishment. Sometimes a boy of 20 has a "mental age" of 12, and vice-versa. To go by the number of years since the subject was brought into the world seems rather unrealistic. It is like putting a 180 pound boxer in the ring with one weighing 120 pounds, because they are both 24 years of age.

IN MEMORIAM

GEORGE M. MacKAY

It was with a great feeling of sorrow to his loved ones and friends that it became known that George M. MacKay had passed away in the Prince County Hospital on February 18th, in the sixty-ninth year of his age. It was not until he entered the hospital three weeks previous to his death that his loved ones and friends became alarmed about his serious condition of health, and all medical skill and good nursing could not restore him to health again.

Left to mourn in his immediate family are his widow, the former Mrs. Mary Jane MacKay, one son, John A., daughter-in-law and grandson, and two brothers in the West, Hugh and Gordon, besides a host of friends and neighbors. Mr. MacKay was a great man in the community always ready to help any one who needed help, as any cause that was for the betterment of the community in which he lived.

It would be safe to say that the Presbyterian Church at New London will miss the outside activities of his life more than any living; on its board of managers for a continuous period of over thirty years, a strong financial supporter and one whose seat was frequently vacant on the Sabbath day. Mr. MacKay was frequently visited during his illness by his pastor, the Rev. Donald Campbell, who conducted the funeral service on February 20th, assisted by the Rev. W. I. Green of Stanley Bridge.

Mr. Campbell spoke along the lines of faithfulness and took as his text: "Be thou faithful unto death and I will give thee a crown of life." Mrs. Angus Green was organist while the choir sang "The Lord's My Shepherd," "Rock of Ages," and "Sleep on, Beloved Sleep." At the conclusion of the service at the home, the remains were borne by the following pall bearers: Francis Murray, Earle Murray, James M. Campbell, Walter Williams, Ray Macleod and Walter Wigmore, and tenderly laid to rest in the family plot in New London Cemetery. Beautiful flowers bore silent testimony and were as follows:

WINNIPEG, (CP) - Most grains took on an easier tone in dull trade on the Winnipeg grain exchange Monday, reflecting the trend of American markets. Flax received fair action, with processor and export buying meeting hedges. Prices dropped sharply lower in the nearby contracts. Oats trade was confined mostly to routine domestic orders. Barley attracted some American interest, while rye dealings were mostly local. Export loadings of Canadian wheat totalled about 1,500,000 bushels during the week-end, including the United Kingdom 750,000 bushels; Republic of Ireland 230,000; Switzerland 355,000; and The Netherlands 160,000.
