

2 Give Evidence At Inquiry Into Death Of RCMP Member

GRAND FALLS, Nfld. (CP)—Two witnesses testified Tuesday at a magisterial inquiry into the death of an RCMP constable shot while investigating a barricaded Chinese restaurant at nearby Bowdoin Nov. 7. The bodies of two Chinese Canadians were later found in an upstairs room.

Const. Terry Hoy of Havelock, Ont., was killed by a shotgun blast fired through the door of a bed-sitting room in the upstairs living quarters of a restaurant occupied by James Ling and his son Kenneth.

Police outside were kept at bay for 12 hours by shots from the bedroom window. They fired a few shots and tear gas bombs in return. During the battle a blaze broke out in the building.

Ling and his 21-year-old son were found dead in the same room. The younger man was believed to have died several days before the shooting incident.

Const. A. A. Bowan said he and Const. Hoy went to the restaurant after waitress Hersey Canning reported Ling had been barricaded in the building four days he refused to let employees enter.

ENTRANCE BARRED

All entrances were barred but the two police officers put a ladder up the side of the building and opened a window to the second floor living quarters. Const. Bowan called to Ling and asked about his son. "Ken gone away," Const. Bowan quoted Ling as saying. "Come back tomorrow."

After receiving further orders, the police officers re-entered the building by the same window. Const. Bowan said he tried unsuccessfully to open the bed-sitting room door.

He then toured the downstairs section of the building. As he was climbing the stairs a shot rang out and Const. Hoy cried out: "I've been shot."

A charge of 12-gauge buckshot struck Hoy in the chest. He died soon after.

Miss Canning said the Lings were not getting along well together.

She testified James had made arrangements to bring a bride for Kenneth from China. Many letters were written to this effect, including some to the immigration department. The bride-to-be was due two weeks before the shooting incident but never arrived, Miss Canning said.

The inquiry will continue today.

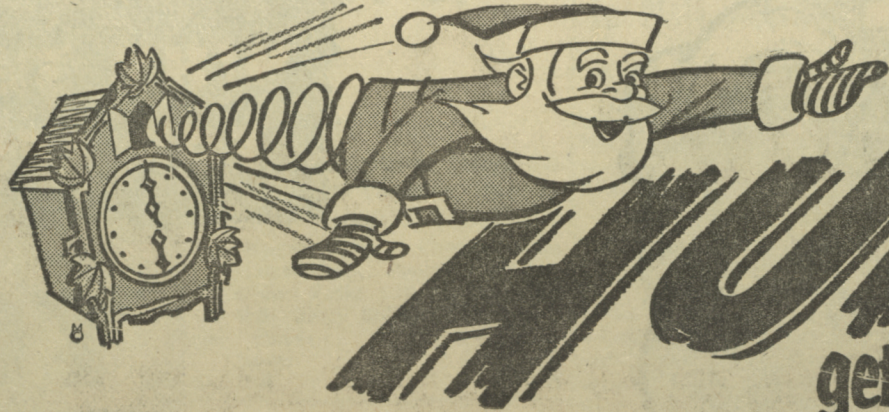
