The Transvaal War

Sir John Tenniel was able to celebrate his eightieth birthday with the cartoon for Roberts' victory, "Brave Bobs," in Punch.

Besides the oldest sons of the Marquis of Dufferin, of Lord Roberts and of Viscount Frankfort de Montmorency, who have been killed, the heirs-apparent or presumptive to the following peerages are under orders for South Africa, or already there: The Dukedoms of Athole, Richmond, St. Albans, and Westminster, the Marquessate of Lansdowne, the Earldoms of Abingdon, Arran, Beauchamp, Derby, Dunmore, Erne, FitzWilliam, Gosford, Granard, Lanesborough, Listowel and Rosse, and the Baronies of Bagot, Balfour of Burleigh, Ebury, Farnham, Iveagh, Leconfield, Loch, Lovat, O'Neill, Tweedmouth and Wimborne.

The family of Colonel Baden-Powell has so many members who are distinguished for cleverness and versatility that it is not surprising that they get a little mixed in the public mind. The tendency at present is to attribute every achievement by a Baden-Powell to the hero of Mafeking. We read almost daily of his war kites and his war balloon, neither of which inventions belongs to him, both being the property of his brother, Major F. S. Baden-Powell, of the Scots Guards, now at the front. He is a recognized authority on aeronautical subjects. His war kites are now in practical use in South Africa aiding Marconi's wireless telegraphy. The major has made 26 voyages in his balloon.

Lord Rosebery made a unique celebration of the relief of Ladysmith by entertaining the inmates of the Epsom Workhouse. On the day that the news of the relief arrived, Lord Rosebery telegraphed to the master expressing a desire to give the inmates a pleasant day in celebration of the event. A bountiful dinner and tea, with dishes of a very varied kind, were provided, and there was an ample distribution of such "comforts" as tobacco, snuff, sweets and fruit. After tea a musical entertainment was given by a number of metropolitan and local artists.

Mr. I. N. Ford thinks that Cecil Rhodes' controversy with the military authorities has armed his enemies with resources for renewing their warfare upon him when he arrives in England. His friends regret some of his indiscretions and are disposed to criticise him for telling too much superfluous truth about the management of the campaign by Buller and Methuen.

It is a long way from the British Isles to Table Bay, and the fact that two hundred thousand men have been carried that distance since the war began, without the loss of a single life, shows that Britain possesses not only the largest, but the most perfect ocean transport system in the world. No other nation, no two nations could have done any such thing. When the honors for the war come to be distributed, by no means the least worthily earned will be those gained by the transport officers at Southampton and Tilbury, and the equally efficient men who have charge of the disembarkations in South Africa.
