Sad Fatality Occurs In Ont.

"Boater's Body in Lake at Club Dock" is the caption in a Toronto paper in regard to a sad fatality which took place there recently. The article is as follows:

Toronto harbour police today recovered the body of Alfred McPhee, 28, of Lake Shore Rd., Long Branch, missing since Friday night in the water near the dock of the National Yacht Club. His boat was found Saturday with a propeller missing off the adjoining Alexandra Yacht Club dock about 50 yards from where the body was recovered. Police are dragging operations there after the missing propeller was found on the dock of the National Yacht Club.

It was originally thought that McPhee had drowned in the waters off the CNE grounds where he was last seen alive in his outboard motorboat.

Harbour police said McPhee apparently experienced motor trouble after his friend left and paddled back to the yacht club. They think he may have fallen into the water as he climbed from the boat to the dock after placing the propeller on the dock. The late Mr. Alfred McPhee named after his grandfather of late Mr. Alfred Robertson of Alexandra was known as "Bus" McPhee. He is a son of the late Mr. James McPhee. His mother (the former Miss Jennie Robertson of Alexandra) lives in Toronto.

ment under the supervision of Miss Doris M. Anderson, B.Sc., M.S., had another very active year. A total of 21 students were enrolled in the various day and evening classes of this Department.

"Beginning October 1, 1957 a two month course in Home Economics is being offered for the first time. This course plus the six-week course given in January and February each year, will be given in place of the full year course in the Home Economics previously offered. It is felt that more young women would be able to take advantage of this shorter and more intensive course.

"In addition to the courses already referred to, all male students in the day trades classes are required to take a general academic course. In this course instruction is given in English, Science, General Knowledge, and Mathematics.

CHANGES IN SCHOOL STAFF
During the school year 1956-57 there were four changes in the school staff: (1) Mrs. Gloria Walker, who was employed as stenographer resigned in June, 1956, and was replaced by Miss Florence Drake of Charlottetown who is doing excellent work (2) Mr. David MacLean, our Academic Teacher, resigned in June, 1956, to accept a position with the Provincial Department of Agriculture. He was replaced by Mr. George MacKay of Darnley, Prince Edward Island who has done very effective teaching in our trades classes.

(3) In September, 1956, Mr. Cyril Lambourn, our Drafting Instructor, resigned to accept a position with a firm in Toronto. His position was held temporarily by Mr. Frank Gaudet of the Forestry Division of the Provincial Department of Agriculture. Mr. Gaudet has done excellent work with our regular drafting class and also with our trades classes.

(4) In May, 1957, after two years of excellent service, our secretary, Miss Isabel Allan resigned to accept a position with the "Federal Department of Agriculture. She was replaced by Miss Jean Walker of Caledonia, Prince Edward Island who is doing very satisfactory work.

HIGHLIGHTS
1. Installation of a new automatic water heating unit by the Department of Public Works.
2. Repainting of the outside woodwork of the whole building.
3. All students received a medical examination under the direct supervision of the public health nurse.

NIGHT COURSES
"Night trade courses are intended for those who wish to gain a knowledge of a trade and also for those actually engaged in a particular trade. Our night classes began on October 1, 1956 and continued till April 30, 1957, a period of seven months. During the fall and winter months, the School was in full operation five nights each week. The public again showed fine interest in evening courses and most of the classes were filled to capacity, the total attendance being 386 students. On April 29 and 30 two informal closures, were held for night students.

SHORT COURSES
During the winter months two short courses were held—a six-week course in Homemaking in which 9 young women were enrolled, and a three-week course in Egg Grading in which eleven young men were enrolled. Members of the Federal Department of Agriculture acted as instructors for the Egg Grading course which was conducted at Birch Court, Experimental Station, Charlottetown.

Reviews Activities Of Vocational School

At the 12th annual Closing Exercises of the Provincial Vocational School held in P. R. of Wales College yesterday afternoon, a detailed report on the accomplishments and activities of the school during the academic year 1956-57 was given by the Principal Mr. E.D. MacPhail.

"Most of us," said Mr. MacPhail, "are acquainted with the history of our school, which was established in the year 1945, as a joint project of the Federal Department of Labour and the Provincial Government. This school is operated under two special agreements between the Government of Canada and the Government of Prince Edward Island. During the first two years of its operation the student body consisted entirely of World War II veterans and in 1947 civilian students were admitted for the first time.

Since that time the number of courses has been increased to twenty, new facilities have been added, and the teaching staff greatly augmented. No new courses have been added this year, but the school has expanded continuously over the past twelve years. The present grand total enrollment in all courses being 579 students. In addition to these, the commerce classes of Prince of Wales College consisting of 71 students are accommodated in the Vocational School building.

POSSIBLE EXPANSION
Our classroom and workshop facilities are now being used to the limit, and the school staff are eagerly looking forward to the time when the present building will be enlarged. We are happy to know that a new five year agreement has been made with the Federal Department of Labour whereby this expansion may be possible.

COURSES
The courses offered by the School may be divided into two groups—day courses and night courses. The day trades courses for this year began on September 4, 1956 and continued till May 28, 1957, a period of almost nine months.

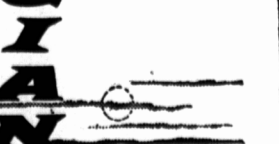

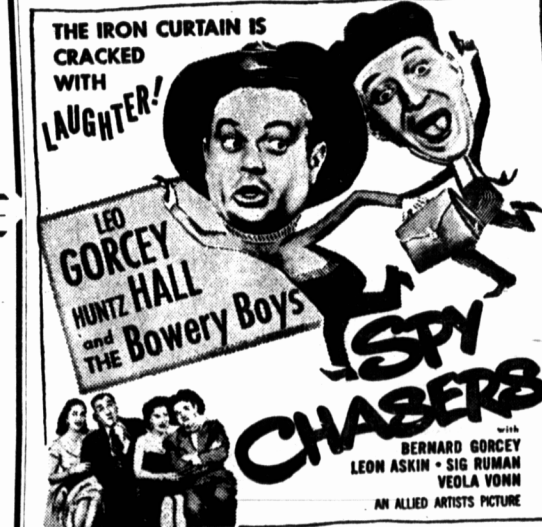

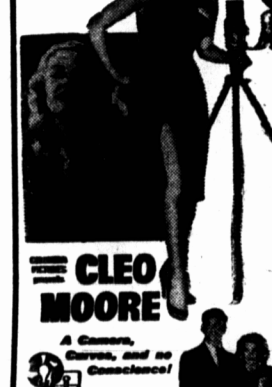
