THE COOK'S CORNER

Boston Brown Bread

One cup molasses, 1 cup sour milk, 1 cup sweet milk, 2 cups cornmeal, cups Graham flour, 1 cup white flour, 1 teaspoon soda, 2 teaspoons salt, 1 tablespoon melted butter. Mix and sift flour, salt and soda several times. Add remaining dry ingredients and mix thoroughly. Add molasses and sour milk and sweet milk and stir until smooth. Beat in melted butter. Turn into oiled and floured pans, cover and steam 2 1/2 hours. Bake ten minutes in a moderately hot oven. Pound baking powder cans make good molds if you haven't the round bread pans. Allow room for the bread to rise so don't fill the molds more than two-thirds full.

A fruit salad would go well with this meal. Serve in season for the highlights in the salad and any other fruit you like. Banana slices if dipped in lemon juice will not discolor, and the salad is much more attractive. Instead of serving mayonnaise, try French dressing made with grapefruit, lemon or peach juice. The combination is unusual and delicious.

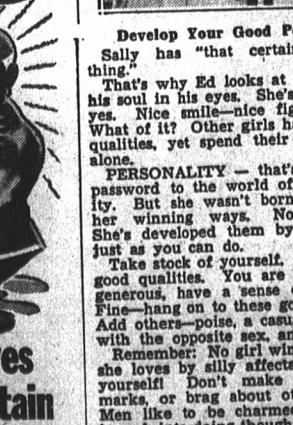

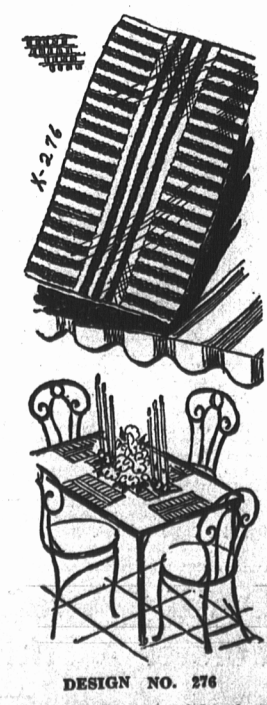

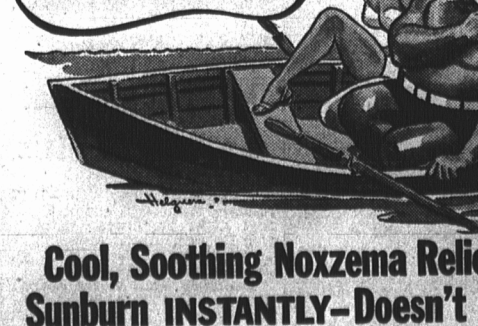
LUNCHEON SET IN COLORS
