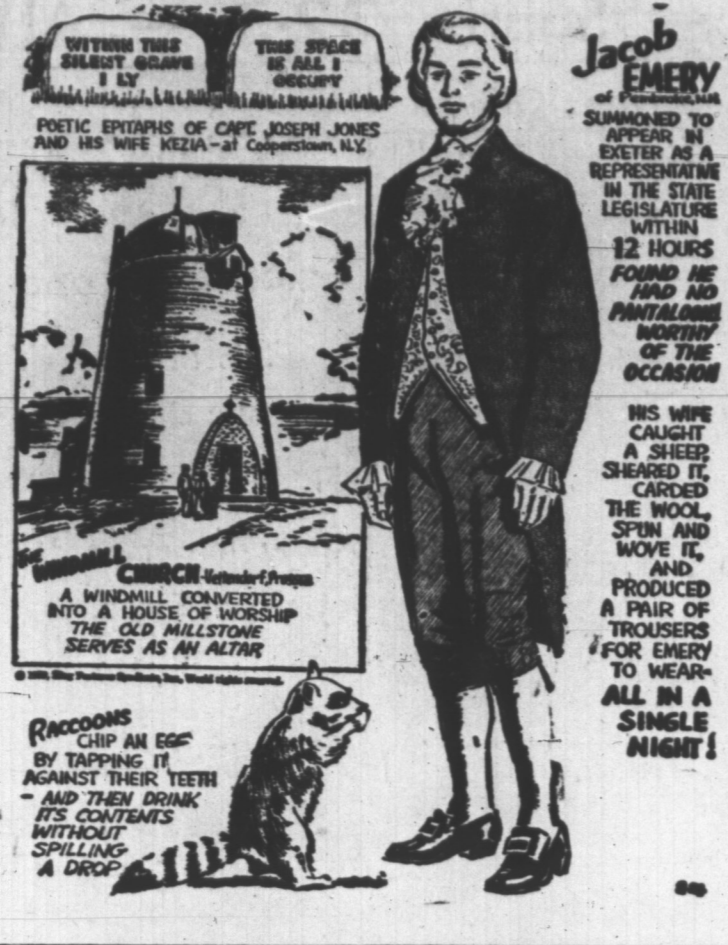

West dealer. Both sides vulnerable. NORTH: ♠ 965, ♥ A Q 9, ♦ 2, ♣ A K Q J 6 5. EAST: ♠ Q J 10 7 3 2, ♥ 10 6 5 3, ♦ K J 9, ♣ 8 7. SOUTH: ♠ A K, ♥ 7 5 4, ♦ A K J 9 7, ♣ 10 4 3.

only high card missing. A diamond finesse, though more likely to succeed, was still an uncertain quantity. Squeeze possibilities had to be eliminated because of communication problems.

Fishbein worked out an unusual line of play to make the hand. Convinced that East had a six-card spade suit as well as the king of hearts, he played accordingly.

He cashed the A-K of spades and A-K of diamonds, discarding the nine of hearts from dummy. Then he ran six club tricks.

East's troubles mounted as the clubs were cashed. He had to come down to three cards. He could see an endplay coming.

East realized that if he kept a high spade and K-x of hearts, declarer would throw him into the lead on the eleventh trick.

But Fishbein's unerring instinct did not fail him. He cashed the ace of hearts, caught the king, and made the slam.
