C.N.R. Testing Refrigerator Cars Built From Aluminum

MONTREAL — Five prototype refrigerator cars, built almost entirely of aluminum, are being extensively tested by Canadian National Railways.

After testing at C.N.R.'s Montreal shops and in service between Montreal and Toronto, the car will undergo accelerated fatigue and impact tests at Aluminum Laboratories Limited, Kingston, Ont.

The lightness of the cars and the consequent reduction in rolling resistance will also mean operating economies.

Increased thickness of insulation and improved insulation due to the reflectivity of aluminum sheet are features of these new cars.

Four of the new cars are being tested under normal service conditions in various parts of Canada.
