

**Federation in South Africa.**

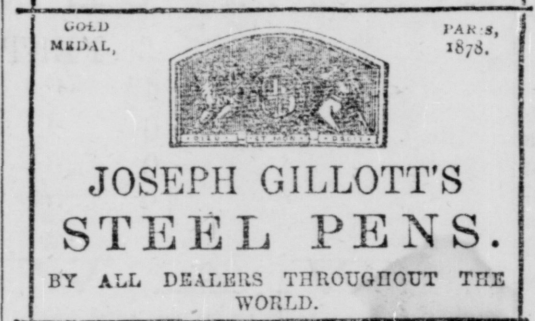

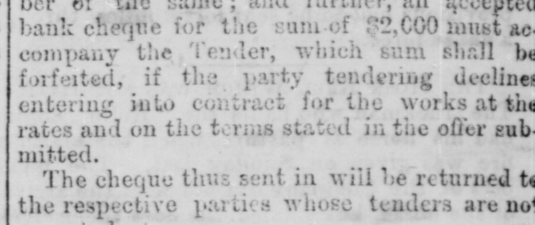
