

Death's Bridge. THE VERDICT OF THE CORONER'S JURY AT CARAQUET.

The coroner's jury on the recent Caraque horror attribute the cause of the disaster to the derangement of a portion of the bridge, caused by the action of the ice during a storm and the unusual high tide of the day previous.

It was the opinion of the jury that the bridge was defective in its plan in that it had no protection from side pressure, such as from ice during a high tide, and they censure both the Dominion and Local Government inspectors for accepting such a railway bridge, situated as it is in a tide-way.

The jury exonerate the trackmen of the section of the road where the accident occurred, as they had been taken off that section to do duty elsewhere by the orders of the superintendent and had not an opportunity of examining the bridge before the engine passed over it.

The jury agree that the signal of danger made by Isaac Cormier was insufficient and given too late to prevent the accident.

The jury find also that the dangerous condition of the bridge was known to Xavier Cormier, Charles Landry, Osair Dugas and others, residing in the vicinity on the morning of the day of the accident, but for reasons best known to themselves they failed to report the condition of the bridge to the Caraque station, the direction from which the train was to come, a distance of about two and one-half miles.
