

Explosion Kills One, Injures 7

RANDOLPH, Mass. (AP)—Three explosions, each followed by huge sheets of flame, Monday destroyed the main plants of two adjacent fireworks companies, killing one man and injuring seven other persons.

The victim, John Vizziello, 64, of Boston, was so badly burned that the body was unidentifiable for more than three hours.

The deafening blasts turned the production centres of the Rockland Fireworks Company and the Bay State Fireworks Company into piles of rubble.

Damage was estimated at more than \$100,000.

Vizziello and about three others were at work in the Rockland plant at the time. No one was in the Bay State plant.

CONDITION SERIOUS

Two of the injured were in serious condition. They are Lewis Massere, 32, one of nine brothers who own Rockland, and a woman identified as Miss Emily Magnusson, about 22, of Randolph.

About a dozen smaller buildings used by both companies for storage were damaged.

Scores of windows were blown out of buildings as far as several hundred yards from the blast. Chunks of plaster and light fixtures were torn loose from the nearby Marshall Paper Tube Co.
