

### Beatle Says U.S. Bigots Caused Furor

NEW YORK (AP)—Beatle-leader John Lennon said here American bigots caused the furor over his religious promulgations.

"There are more people in America, so there are more bigots also," he told a news conference.

The British quartet is winding up another American tour. Beatle records have been banned by some American radio stations because of Lennon's published remark that "we're more popular than Jesus now." Later Lennon said he was sorry for the way people took his statement.

In the light of this statement, reporters were amused when an aide said in advance of the Beatles' arrival at the news conference: "The Beatles are about to enter and I'd like to ask you people in the front to kneel."

Amid laughter, the aide amended: "I mean so the guys in back can get their picture."

**PERCHED 21 STOREYS UP**

Earlier, two girls threatened for 20 minutes to jump from the 21st floor of the Americana Hotel unless "we get to see the Beatles."

"I think it's all silly," Lennon said of the incident!

A policeman eventually got on his knees and persuaded the girls to come away from the ledge where they were perched.

The Beatles arrived early Monday from St. Louis. They will perform in Shea Stadium tonight.

### Courses Offered N.B. Fishermen

OTTAWA (CP)—New Brunswick fishermen will be able to upgrade their education this fall through extension courses offered them at the University of Moncton.

A fisheries department announcement said an annual grant will be made to the university to provide courses in new fisheries techniques and co-operative producing and selling. Several other Maritime schools already receive these grants.

### UFO ORIGIN THEORY HELD

WASHINGTON (AP)—An electronics engineer - Journalist said here a form of ball lightning, generated by high tension power lines, may help explain many recent sightings of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs).

Philip J. Klass, senior editor of Aviation Week and Space Technology magazine, said most of the UFO sightings reported in the vicinity of Exeter, N.H., a year ago, were along or very near high-tension lines.

Klass said studies show luminous balls of ionized air are generated by the electric corona that occurs on high-tension lines under certain conditions.

This phenomena, in view of the expanding numbers of high voltage power lines, could explain the increasing frequency of UFO sightings in recent years, he said.

Ball lightning usually appears as a round, moving blub of light and is strikingly similar to the Exeter sightings in color, shape, size, sputtering sound, hovering nature, sudden extremely high speeds, and spinning, rolling, gliding and bounding movements, Klass said.

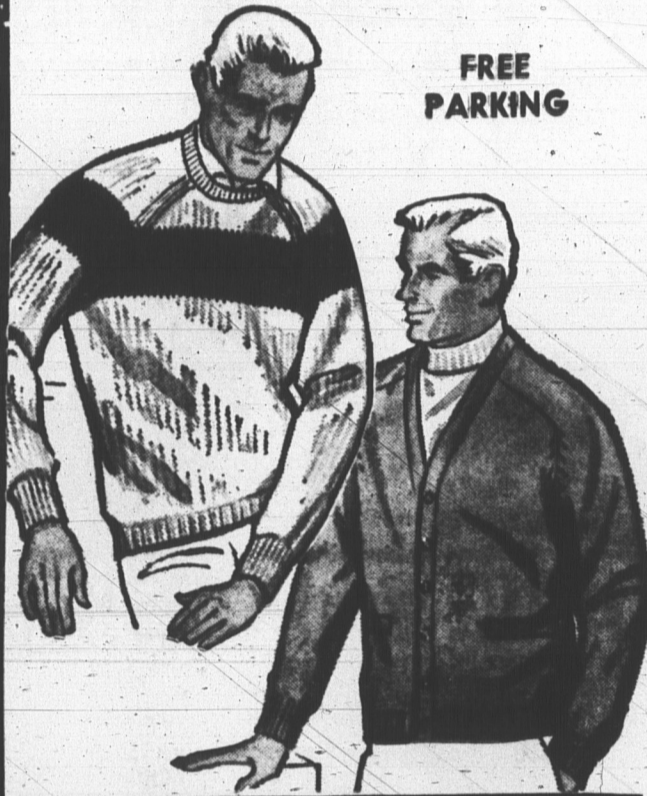
### LIFT BOND BAN

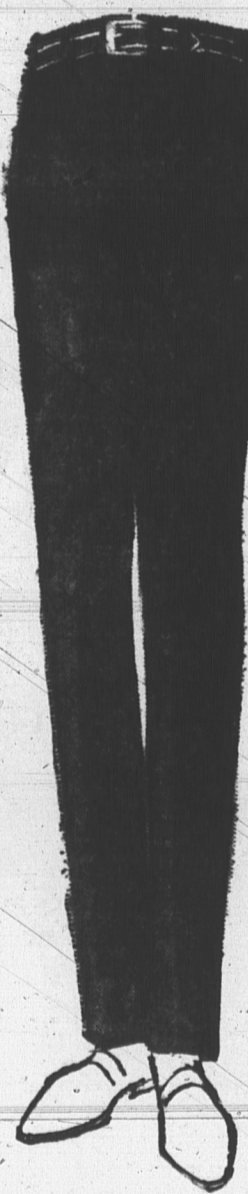

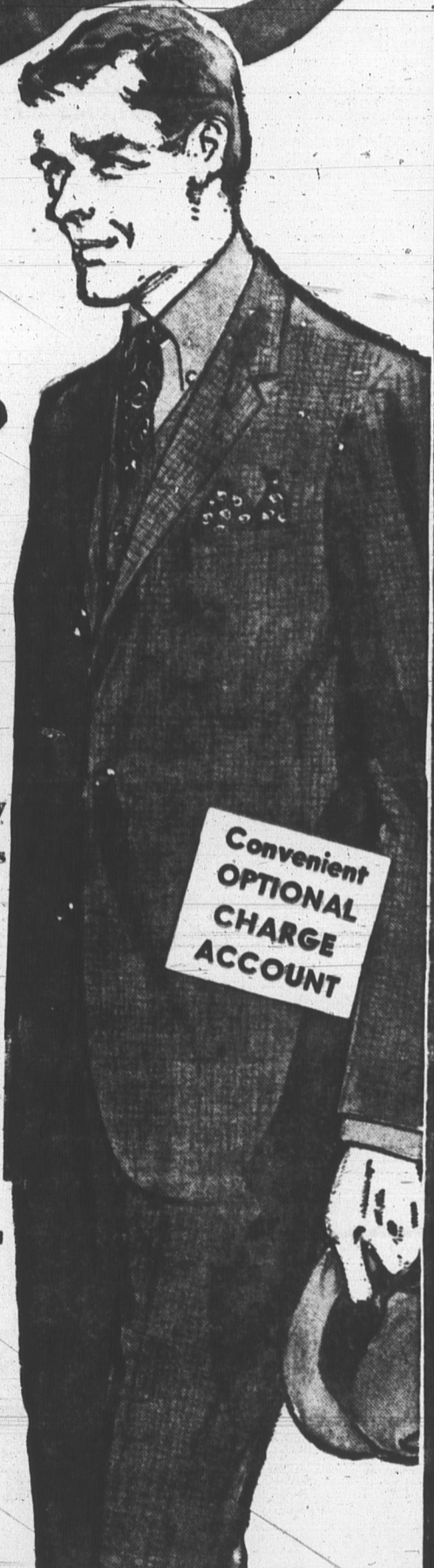
