

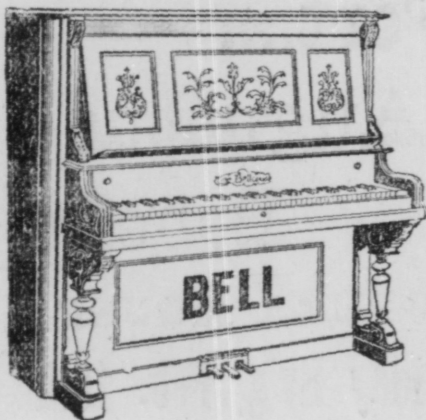

MEETING OF PRESBYRY.

The Presbytery of Prince Edward Island met Monday the 14th inst, in the church at Lot 14 and was constituted, Mr Geo Millar, Moderator pro tempore, with whom were present, Messrs J K Fraser, J M Fisher and T F Fullerton, ministers.

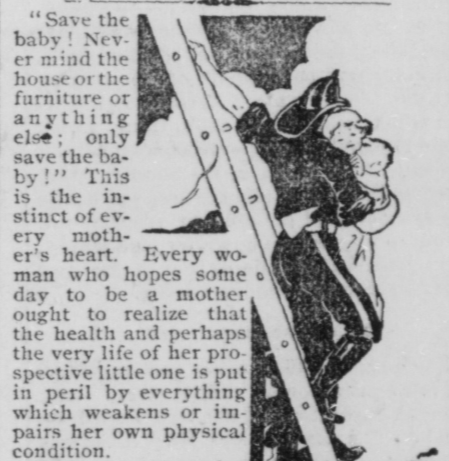
After public worship, conducted by Mr Fisher, the Presbytery held a lengthy conference with the congregation, the outcome of which was that an ordained missionary will be appointed for one year, who, together with a catechist during the summer months, will take charge of the congregation under the direction of the Presbytery's Home Mission Committee. It was agreed to apply to the Assembly Home Mission Board for an ordained missionary and a catechist.

Messrs Fraser, Fisher, Dill, and McDonald were appointed a committee with Presbyterial power, to meet with the members of the Session in Richmond Bay West at Victoria West on Tuesday 22nd inst at 1 p m

The Presbytery agreed to recommend Messrs J H A Anderson and James Ramsay, students to Home Mission Board as catechists during the Summer.

The Presbytery then adjourned to meet in St. James' hall, Charlottetown, on Tuesday 15th day of March at 11 a. m.

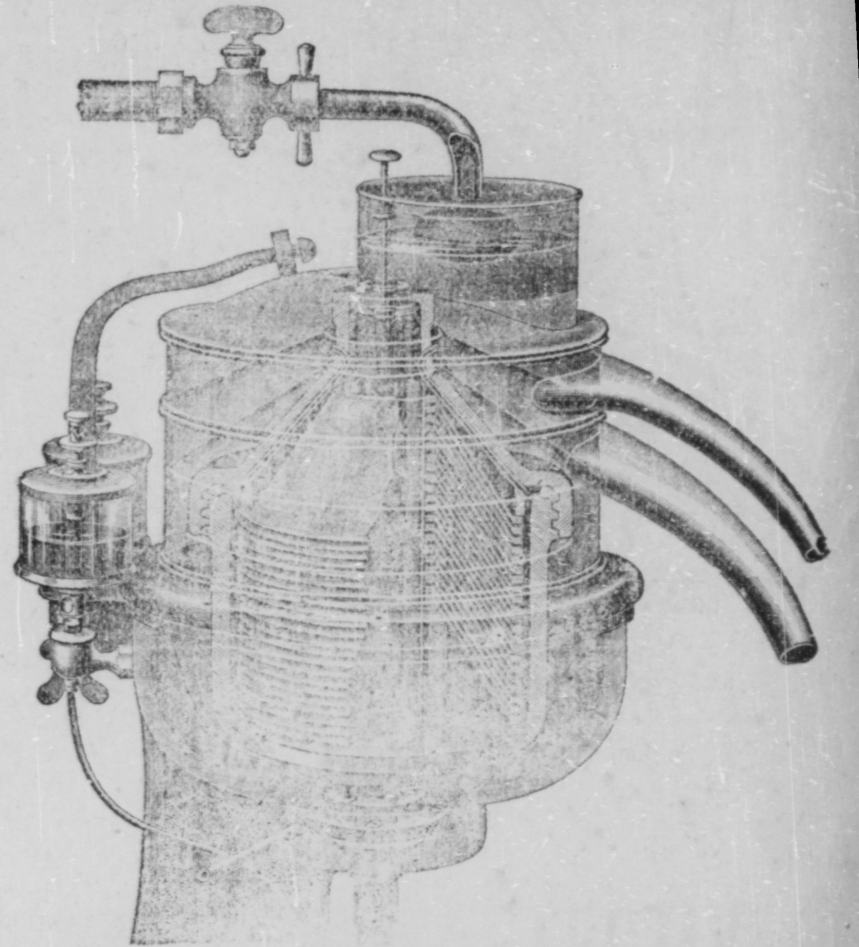
