SERIOUS ACCIDENT IN KING'S CO.

High Sheriff McInnis Injured. On Friday last High Sheriff McInnis met with a very serious accident at McDonald's Mill Bridge, Lot 57, while driving from the residence of his mother at Peake's Road to Georgetown. The bridge at McDonald's Mill is built over a considerable stream, and is about 15 feet above the water. We learn that early on Friday morning the Sheriff was proceeding to Georgetown, and when crossing the bridge his horse took fright at a hole in it, where a plank some 12 inches wide had fallen out. The horse began to back, and as there was no railing or even curb-piece on the bridge at the highest part of it, the Sheriff was unable to control the animal, and the wagon, horse and man went tumbling to the bottom. The Sheriff had a very narrow escape, as the horse rolled over him, striking him on the body with his feet, and one of the shafts went through his fur coat and then stuck in the bottom of the river. The horse was badly injured, the wagon broken to pieces, and the Sheriff is seriously crippled, being hardly able to walk. Mr. Mooney, of Ruskin, happened to come along shortly after the accident, and he gathered some of the neighbors, who succeeded in getting the horse back to Peake's Road. The Sheriff went on to Georgetown, where he had some land sales, but was suffering greatly from the effects of his injuries.
